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9 A BILL  
10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT  
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13 Relating to the City of Troy in Pike County; to  
14 authorize the City Council of the City of Troy to provide by  
15 local ordinance for the sale of alcoholic beverages for  
16 on-premises and off-premises consumption on Sundays by  
17 properly licensed retail licensees serving the general public;  
18 and to provide a referendum.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

20 Section 1. The City Council of the City of Troy, by  
21 ordinance, may regulate and permit the sale of alcoholic  
22 beverages for on-premises and off-premises consumption after  
23 12:00 p.m. on Sundays, as determined by the governing body, by  
24 properly licensed retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage  
25 Control Board serving the general public.

26 Section 2. Section 1 of this act shall become  
27 operative only if approved by a majority of the qualified

1 electors of the City of Troy who vote in an election to be  
2 held on a day designated by the City Council of the City of  
3 Troy. The notice of the election shall be given by the City  
4 Council, and the election shall be held, conducted, and the  
5 results canvassed in the manner as other city elections. The  
6 election shall be held on a date set by the City Council or  
7 may be held in conjunction with the next regularly scheduled  
8 state or local election to be held in the city. The question  
9 shall be, "Do you favor the adoption of Act No. \_\_\_\_, of the  
10 \_\_\_\_ Session of the Alabama Legislature authorizing the sale  
11 of alcoholic beverages after 12:00 p.m. on Sundays in the City  
12 of Troy? Yes ( ) No ( )." The city shall pay any costs and  
13 expenses not otherwise reimbursed by a governmental agency  
14 which are incidental to the election. If a majority of the  
15 votes cast in the election are "Yes," Section 1 of this act  
16 shall become operative immediately. If the majority of the  
17 votes are "No," this act shall be repealed and shall have no  
18 further effect.

19 Section 3. This act shall become effective  
20 immediately following its passage and approval by the  
21 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
