1 commanding generals, and ultimately as Special Assistant to 2 the Secretary of the Air Force (Finance); he flew more than 100 combat missions in Vietnam as an F-4 pilot and as vice 3 4 commander of the 366th Tactical Fighter Wing; highly decorated, he earned the Legion of Merit with one oak leaf 5 6 cluster, the Bronze Star, the Distinguished Flying Cross with 7 three oak leaf clusters, the Air Medal with 11 oak leaf clusters, and at least 10 other honors; and 8

9 WHEREAS, after providing 23 years of laudable service and attaining the rank of Colonel, Mr. Pewitt retired 10 11 from the Air Force and joined the staff at the University of 12 Alabama at Birmingham, where he progressed through the ranks 13 to become Senior Vice President for Administration; he was 14 active in numerous civic organizations in his adopted city and 15 he was a graduate of Leadership Birmingham and Leadership Alabama; his love of aviation led him to serve as Chair of the 16 17 Board and Director of the Southern Museum of Flight; he was a faithful and devoted member of Canterbury United Methodist 18 Church; and 19

20 WHEREAS, survivors include his beloved and devoted 21 wife of 64 years, Betty Hightower Pewitt; his three sons, 22 Ransom D. (Laura), James P.
