2 IBM in 1983, and was owner and founder of the Browns Creek
3 Sailboat Marina; he served as sailing instructor at the
4 University of Alabama in Huntsville; and

5 WHEREAS, survivors include his children, Robert
6 Ernest (Pam) Moore and Jeanette Lynn (David) Ogden; a sister,
7 Lucille Moore Dettor; uncles, Frank (Carol) Moore, and William
8 (Harriot) Moore; and sister-in-law Patricia Glover; and

10 member of Epiphany Episcopal Church and a valued member of the
11 community; although his presence is greatly missed, his memory
