1 (c) Any student, parent, or guardian requesting a 2 school board employee to apply sunscreen to a student shall present to the nurse a Parent Prescriber Authorization Form 3 (PPA) containing a parent or guardian signature. A physician 4 5 signature or physician order shall not be required. Section 2. This act shall become effective 6 7 immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law. 8
