22	Church, Governor Brewer taught a men's Sunday School Class and
23	served in numerous positions, including as a life deacon and
24	as a trustee; he was loyal to God and his family and served
25	the citizens of Alabama with distinction; and
26	WHEREAS, Governor Brewer joined Samford University
27	in 1987 as a Distinguished Professor of Law and Government

teaching in Samford's College of Arts and Sciences and

Cumberland School of Law; he served three terms as trustee at

Samford and served terms as vice-chair and chair of the

executive committee; and

WHEREAS, among many initiatives credited to Governor Brewer during his lifetime of public service are the creation of the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, the Education Study Commission, the Alabama Development Office, the state motor pool, and the Public Affairs Research Council of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Governor Brewer's life set a standard for integrity and professionalism in public service to which all public servants can aspire; and

WHEREAS, Governor Brewer was preceded in death by
Martha Farmer Brewer, his beloved wife of 56 years; and
