14	WHEREAS, Alton R. Barnes, Sr., learned the
15	importance of hard work while growing up on a dairy farm near
16	the cotton mill town of Sycamore, Alabama; he served with much
17	honor as a member of the 158th Regiment Combat Team in the
18	Pacific Theater during World War II; upon returning home, he
19	obtained many life milestones including marrying his wife,
20	joining the Alabama National Guard as a second lieutenant,
21	finishing high school, and entering Jacksonville State
22	University, where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in
23	Education; and
24	WHEREAS, Alton R. Barnes, Sr., taught for one year
25	at the high school level; he was called into active duty a
26	second time and served in Japan during the Korean War; after
27	his service, he returned to the Alabama Army National Guard

and later went to work with the Guard full time in Talladega, Alabama, as a command administrative assistant; in 1956, he was selected by the Guard's Adjutant General to organize the Alabama Guard's first officer candidate school, the Alabama Military Academy; he commanded the program for more than 20 years; his leadership and dedication to the program of training future officers known as AMA (Alabama Military Academy) impacted the quality of the leadership in the Alabama National Guard; this quality of leadership allowed Alabama to be recognized as the best State National Guard organization in America during those years; the direct influence provided by Colonel Barnes to hundreds of individuals has allowed them to be successful not only as military leaders but leaders in their communities, counties, and our state; these individuals saw their lives drastically improved by Colonel Brown's leadership; he retired with the rank of Colonel while serving as Assistant Adjutant General of Alabama; and
