- (6) One member appointed by the Governor.
- (b) The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure the advisory council membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state. The chair and vice chair of the advisory council shall be elected at the first meeting by the members of the advisory council.
- (c) The advisory council shall develop an outcome-based funding model for the allocation of Education Trust Fund appropriations to the publicly supported community and technical colleges in Alabama for institutional operations. The advisory council may create ad hoc working groups, consisting of persons selected by the advisory council for this purpose, to advise and assist the advisory council in carrying out its duties.
- (d) The outcome-based funding model developed by the advisory council shall be all of the following:
- (1) Used to align institutional funding with statewide priorities for community and technical college education by encouraging programs and services focused on student success and providing incentives for progress toward statewide goals built around a set of shared principles that

- (2) Employ appropriate productivity metrics that are aligned with goals and objectives for community and technical college education attainment in this state.
- (e) The outcome-based funding model developed by the advisory council shall also include metrics that align with any statewide plan or goals subsequently adopted for education entities in the state. In order to provide incentives for progress consistent with the state's education policy goals and objectives, the funding model shall incorporate metrics considering effectiveness, affordability, and efficiency including, but not limited to:
 - (1) Differences in institutional missions.
 - (2) Completion of students' educational goals.
- (3) Progression toward students' completion of programs of study including a degree, certificate, or credential.
- (4) Institutional collaboration that encourages the successful transfer of students.
 - (5) Success in serving underrepresented students.
- 22 (6) Production of students graduating with 23 credentials in science, technology, engineering, mathematics, 24 and other high-demand fields.

(h) Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of
the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the
advisory council. The advisory council shall report its
findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Governor,
the Chair of the House Ways and Means Education Committee, and
the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation Education
Committee not later than January 1, 2018, whereupon the
advisory council shall stand dissolved and discharged of any
further duties and liabilities. Each legislative member of the
committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative
compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or
she attends a meeting of the committee in accordance with
Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These
payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the
use of the Legislature.
