The term 11 includes child care centers, day nurseries, nursery 12 schools, pre-kindergartens, kindergartens, and play 13 groups, including those that are operated as part 14 of a private school if they provide care for more 15 than four hours a day. 16 Also under existing law, child care 17 facilities that are part of a church or nonprofit 18 religious school are exempt from licensing by the Department of Human Resources. 19 20 This bill would establish the Child Care 21 Safety Act. 22 This bill would revise the definition of day 23 care center to include preschools. 24 This bill would remove certain exemptions from licensure for child care facilities that are 25 26 part of a church or nonprofit religious school by

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 1 2 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited 3 as the Child Care Safety Act. Section 2. Sections 13A-6-29, 38-7-2, 38-7-3, 4 38-13-2, and 38-13-3, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to 5 read as follows: 6 "\$13A-6-29. 7 "(a) As used in this section, the following terms 8 9 shall have the following meanings: 10 "(1) MEDICALLY PRESCRIBED. In accordance with a physician's prescription or in accordance with age-appropriate 11 directions for the over-the-counter medication. 12 13 "(2) NEAR FATALITY. An act that, as certified by a physician, places the child in serious or critical condition. 14 15 "(b) There is established the crime of administration of medication by the owner, operator, or 16 17 employee of a licensed or statutorily exempt child care 18 facility with the intent to drug the child or alter the child's behavior beyond what is medically prescribed or with 19 20 the reckless disregard for the health, safety, and welfare of 21 the child. 22 "(c) A violation of subsection (b) is punishable as 23 follows: 24 "(1) A violation which does not cause or contributes 25 to the death, near fatality, dismemberment, or permanent disability of a child is a Class C felony. 26

"(2) A violation which causes a near fatality,
 dismemberment, or permanent disability of a child is a Class B
 felony.

7 "Terms used in this chapter, unless the context 8 otherwise requires, have the meanings ascribed to them in this 9 section. "(3) CHILD-PLACING AGENCY. A public or private 8 9 child-care facility which receives, places, or arranges for 10 the placement of any child or children in adoptive or foster family homes or other facilities for child care apart from the 11 custody of the child's or children's parents. The term 12 13 "child-placing agency" includes, but is not limited to, all 14 agencies established and maintained by a municipality or other 15 political subdivision of the State of Alabama to protect, quard, train, or care for children outside their own homes, 16 17 but does not include any circuit court or juvenile court or 18 any duly appointed juvenile probation officer or youth counselor of the court who receives and places children under 19 20 an order of the court.

"(4) DAY CARE CENTER. Any child-care facility receiving more than 12 children for daytime care during all or part of a day. The term "day care center" includes, but is not limited to, facilities commonly called "child-care centers," day nurseries," "nursery schools," "pre-kindergartens," "preschools," "kindergartens," and "play groups," with or without stated educational purposes. The term further

includes, but is not limited to, pre-kindergarten, preschool,
kindergarten, or nursery schools or other daytime programs
operated as a part of a private school and receiving children
younger than lawful school age for daytime care for more than
four hours a day, with or without stated educational purposes.
The term does not include any of the following:

7 "a. Kindergartens or nursery schools or other
8 daytime programs operated by public elementary systems or
9 secondary level school units or institutions of higher
10 learning.

"b. Kindergartens or nursery schools or other daytime programs, with or without stated educational purposes, operating no more than four hours a day and receiving children younger than lawful school age.

15 "c. Kindergartens or nursery schools or other 16 daytime programs operated as a part of a private school and 17 receiving children younger than lawful school age for four 18 hours a day or less, with or without stated educational 19 purposes.

Facilities operated for more than four hours a day in connection with a shopping center or service or other similar facility, where transient children are cared for temporarily while parents or custodians of the children are occupied on the premises or are in the immediate vicinity and readily available. The facilities shall meet local and state fire and health requirements. "e. Any type of day care center that is conducted on
 federal government premises.

Special activities programs for children of 4 lawful school age including, but not limited to, athletics, 5 crafts instruction and similar activities conducted on an 6 organized and periodic basis by civic, charitable, and 7 governmental organizations provided local and state fire and 8 health requirements are met.

9 "(5) DAY CARE HOME. A child-care facility which is a 10 family home and which receives not more than six children for 11 care during the day.

12 "(6) DEPARTMENT. The Department of Human Resources13 of the State of Alabama.

"(7) FACILITY FOR CHILD CARE or CHILD-CARE FACILITY. 14 15 A facility established by any person, group of persons, agency, association, or organization, whether established for 16 17 gain or otherwise, who or which receives or arranges for care 18 or placement of one or more children, unrelated to the operator of the facility, apart from the parents, with or 19 20 without the transfer of the right of custody, in any facility 21 as defined in this chapter, established and maintained for the care of children. 22

"(8) FOSTER FAMILY HOME. A child-care facility in a
residence of a family where the family receives a child or
children, unrelated to that family, for the purpose of
providing family care or therapeutic family care and training,

or transitional living program services on a full-time basis.
 The types of foster family homes are defined as follows:

"a. Boarding home. A foster family home wherein the
foster family receives a child or children and receives
payment for their care. The number of children so received
shall not exceed six, unless the children are of common

"(9) GROUP DAY CARE HOME. A child-care facility which is a family home and which receives at least seven but no more than 12 children for care during part of the day where there are at least two adults present and supervising the activities.

17 "(10) GROUP HOME. A child-care facility where at 18 least seven but not more than 10 children are received and 19 maintained for the purpose of providing them with care or 20 training or both, or transitional living program services.

"(11) MATERNITY CENTER. A facility in which any person, agency, or corporation receives or cares for one or more minor pregnant girls, except that the term does not include hospitals.

25 "(12) NIGHT CARE FACILITY. A child-care facility26 which is a center or a family home receiving a child or

1 children for care during the night. A "night care facility" is
2 further defined as follows:

3 "a. Nighttime center. A facility which is
4 established to receive more than 12 children for nighttime

6 "b. Nighttime home. A family home which receives no 7 more than six children for nighttime care.

The system contains criminal history background 19 20 information for fingerprint-based and name-based searches.

"(5) CARE. The provision of care, treatment,
education, training, instruction, supervision, or recreation
to children, adults, or individuals with disabilities.

"(6) CARETAKER SETTING. A building, structure, or
location, public or private property, or vehicle, utilized for
or involved in the providing of care, education, training,
instruction, or supervision of children, adults, or

individuals with disabilities or transportation in connection
 with activity provided by a licensed, approved, or certified
 child or adult care facility.

4 "(7) CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER. The Commissioner of
5 the Department of Human Resources, the director of a county
6 department of human resources, or the head of an employer
7 covered by this chapter, but not specifically enumerated.

8 "(8) CHILD or CHILDREN. An individual under 19 years 9 of age.

10 "(9) CHILD CARE FACILITY. A person or entity holding 11 a Department of Human Resources license, permit, or approval 12 to provide child care, including foster care, under Chapter 7 13 of this title. The term excludes <u>includes</u> exempt child care 14 facilities.

"(10) CHILD PLACING AGENCY. A person or entity

19 "(11) CONVICTION. A determination of guilt as the 20 result of a plea, including a plea of nolo contendere, or a 21 trial.

"(12) CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND INFORMATION CHECK.
 The review of any and all records containing any information
 collected and stored in the criminal record repository of the
 Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Alabama Criminal Justice
 Information Center, and the Alabama Department of Public
 Safety State Law Enforcement Agency involving an arrest or

conviction by a criminal justice agency, including, but not 1 2 limited to, child abuse crime information as defined by 42 3 U.S.C. § 5119, the National Child Protection Act of 1993, conviction record information, fingerprint cards, correctional 4 5 data and release information, and identifiable descriptions and notations of convictions. Criminal history background 6 7 information shall not include any analytical records or investigative reports that contain intelligence information or 8 9 criminal investigation information.

10 "(13) CURRENT. An individual who is presently 11 employed, licensed, or approved, or working as a volunteer on 12 November 1, 2000.

"(14) DAILY LIVING TASKS. Activities of daily
living, including walking, working, learning, grooming and
hygiene, bathing, dressing, eating, cooking, cleaning,
shopping, transportation, managing money, maintaining a
residence, writing, and using telephones, computers, and other
automated communication devices.

19 "(15) ELDERLY. An individual 65 years of age or 20 older.

"(16) EMPLOYEE. An individual currently in the service of an employer for compensation, full-time or part-time, and employed by contract or at will, in which the employer has the authority to control the person in the material details of how work shall be performed and when compensation shall be provided. 1 "(17) EMPLOYER. An individual, person, group of 2 persons, association, partnership, corporation, limited 3 liability company or partnership, business, or other entity 4 which hires employees, has volunteers, or contracts with 5 others to provide personnel to work with or provide care to 6 children, adults, or individuals with disabilities in a 7 caretaker setting.

8 "(18) ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS. The fundamental, not 9 merely marginal, job duties of the employment as determined by 10 a written job description or the judgment of the employer.

11 "(19) EXEMPT CARE FACILITY. A person or entity 12 exempt by law from licensure by the Department of Human 13 Resources, or a child placing agency, including church day 14 care, child centers, or elder centers <u>adult care facilities</u>.

"(20) INDIVIDUAL. A natural person.

16 "(21) INDIVIDUAL WITH DISABILITIES. A person with a 17 mental or physical impairment who requires assistance to 18 perform one or more daily living tasks.

19 "(22) LAW ENFORCEMENT. The sheriff's department of a20 county or the police department of a municipality.

"(23) LICENSE. A license, permit, certification, approval, registration, or other form of permission required by law by whatever designation for a child care facility, adult care facility, child placing agency, foster parent or foster home, adoptive parent or adoptive home, or any other person or entity in which an individual has unsupervised access to children, the elderly, or individuals with
 disabilities.

"(24) LICENSED SOCIAL WORKER. A social worker
licensed by the Alabama State Board of Social Work Examiners
to conduct family home studies and psychosocial assessments in
adoptive or custody cases by court order or for treatment not
otherwise required to conduct a criminal history check.

8 "(25) LICENSEE. Holder of a license or approval and 9 an adult household member whose residence is in the home in 10 regards to child care and adult care facilities in a home 11 setting.

"(26) PERSON or ENTITY. A natural person, sometimes 12 13 referred to as an individual, an owner or operator of any 14 adult care facility, child care facility, child placing 15 agency, exempt child care facility, or licensee, whether an 16 individual, corporation, limited liability company or partnership, partnership, association, or other legal entity 17 18 or group, and a board member, an officer, member, or partner of an entity who has direct contact with children, the 19 20 elderly, or individuals with disabilities in care.

"(27) REASONABLE SUSPICION. Belief by a prudent person that reasonable articulable grounds exist to suspect that the employee's past or present behavior should be reviewed to determine if such behavior or conduct bears upon the individual's fitness to teach or supervise or have responsibility for the safety and well-being of children, the

- elderly, or persons with disabilities as defined in this
 chapter.
- 3 "(28) REPORT. A written statement of criminal
 4 history background information.
- 5 "(29) RESIDENCE. Place of abode, domicile, or
 6 dwelling with intention to remain permanently and continuously
 7 or for an indefinite or uncertain length of time.
- 8 "(30) SEX CRIME. Includes <u>any sex crime listed in</u>
 9 <u>Section 15-20A-5.</u> the following:
- 10 "a. Enticing a child to enter a vehicle, room,
 11 house, office, or any other place for immoral purposes, as
 12 proscribed by Section 13A-6-69.
- 13 "b. Incest, when the offender is an adult and the
 14 victim is a minor, as proscribed by Section 13A-13-3.
- 15 "c. Kidnapping of a minor, except by a parent, in
 16 the first or second degree, as proscribed by Section 13A-6-43
 17 or Section 13A-6-44.
- 18 "d. Promoting prostitution in the first or second

A decision that an 23 individual is or is not suitable for employment, volunteer 24 work, or licensure based upon the existence of a prohibited 25 criminal conviction. 26 "(33) UNSUPERVISED ACCESS TO A CHILD OR CHILDREN, THE ELDERLY, OR AN INDIVIDUAL WITH DISABILITIES. Contacts, 27

interviews, questions, examinations, interaction, or communications outside the presence, supervision, and control of someone other than a child or elderly or disabled individual in care during the provision of care, education, training, instruction, supervision, or other employment or license related activities.

7 "(34) VOLUNTEER. An individual who provides services
8 without an express or implied promise of compensation, but
9 shall not include the parent, family member, legal custodian,
10 or legal guardian of a child, the elderly, or disabled
11 individual in care.

"(35) WRITTEN CONSENT. A signed statement by theapplicant or employee containing all of the following:

14 "a. The name, address, date of birth, race, gender, 15 and Social Security number appearing on a valid identification document as defined in subsection (d) of 18 U.S.C. § 1028. If 16 the applicant does not have a Social Security number because 17 18 of sincerely held personal beliefs, the Social Security number shall not be required and the Department of Human Resources 19 20 and the Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law 21 Enforcement Agency shall provide an alternative means of 22 identification and procedure.

23 "b. Notice to the applicant or employee of the right 24 to obtain a copy of the criminal history background 25 information check report, challenge the accuracy and 26 completeness of any information contained in the report, and to obtain a prompt determination as to the validity of a
 challenge.

"c. Name, address, and telephone number of the
employer or licensing entity for which the criminal history
background information check report is being sought.

"d. Release of the criminal history background
information check report to the Department of Human Resources.

9 "(a) On November 1, 2000, every employer, child care 10 facility, adult care facility, the Department of Human 11 Resources, and child placing agency shall request the 12 Department of Public Safety <u>Alabama State Law Enforcement</u> 13 <u>Agency</u> to conduct a criminal history background information 14 check for the following:

"(1) An employment applicant, employee or volunteer of an employer, child care facility, adult care facility, or child placing agency.

18 "(2) A current foster parent for a child or adult or adult household member of a foster family or applicant and an 19 20 adult household member of a foster family seeking approval to 21 operate as a foster parent or foster family home for a child 22 placing agency or the Department of Human Resources. Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, no criminal history 23 24 background information check shall be conducted on a current 25 foster parent or household member of a foster family if a 26 Federal Bureau of Investigation and Alabama Department of Public Safety State Law Enforcement Agency criminal history 27

background information check has already been conducted under 1 2 other law that meets the suitability criteria as provided in 3 this chapter. Subsequent arrests or convictions of foster parents, or arrests or convictions entered into the automated 4 5 system subsequent to the initial report, shall be sent by the Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement 6 7 Agency to the Department of Human Resources as provided in 8 this chapter.

"(3) An applicant or employee, with the exception of 9 10 those individuals on employed status on November 1, 2000, in a position in the Department of Human Resources which requires 11 unsupervised access to children, the elderly, or individuals 12 13 with disabilities as one of the essential functions of the 14 job. All current employees of the Department of Human 15 Resources shall be subjected to a criminal history background 16 information check upon reasonable suspicion. Criminal history 17 background information checks shall be required for 18 prospective and current personnel under contract with the Department of Human Resources or working with another entity 19 20 under contract with the Department of Human Resources, 21 students, mentors, and volunteers in positions requiring 22 unsupervised access to children, the elderly, or persons with disabilities as one of the essential functions of the job. The 23 24 Department of Human Resources shall pay any fees related to 25 checks required pursuant to this subdivision.

"(4) A current licensee or applicant for a license
 through the Department of Human Resources to operate a child
 care or adult care facility.

"(5) An adoptive parent applicant for a child 4 5 adoptive placement through the Department of Human Resources 6 or child placing agency and any Department of Human Resources 7 or child placing agency approved adoptive parent prior to entry of a final decree of adoption. Unless otherwise provided 8 9 in this chapter, no criminal history background information 10 check shall be conducted on a current adoptive parent or household member of an adoptive family if a Federal Bureau of 11 12 Investigation and Alabama Department of Public Safety State 13 Law Enforcement Agency criminal history background information check has already been conducted under other law that meets 14 15 the suitability criteria as provided in this chapter. Subsequent arrests or convictions of adoptive parents, or 16 17 arrests or convictions entered into the automated system 18 subsequent to the initial report, shall be sent by the Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement 19 20 Agency to the Department of Human Resources as elsewhere 21 provided in this chapter.

"(b) An employer, child care facility, adult care facility, the Department of Human Resources, or a child placing agency may only request a criminal history background information check by its chief executive officer, or his or her designee authorized in writing and notarized, and law enforcement shall render assistance, including assistance in obtaining fingerprints required for submission of a request to
 the Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement
 Agency.

"(c) Every employee, volunteer or applicant, for 4 5 employment or a volunteer position, licensee, Department of 6 Human Resources adoptive parent applicant or approved adoptive 7 parent, or applicant for a license to the Department of Human Resources to operate a child care or adult care facility shall 8 9 submit two sets of fingerprints and sign a written consent to 10 obtain the criminal history background information. Fingerprints shall not be required when a disability prevents 11 a person from being fingerprinted. Disabilities preventing 12 13 fingerprinting include the loss of both hands, severe scarring 14 of all fingers, closed paralytic hands, and similar 15 disabilities. In cases involving disability, a written consent to obtain available criminal history background information by 16 name only shall be obtained. No one who fails or refuses to 17 18 give written consent or submit fingerprints necessary to obtain criminal history background information may be 19 20 employed, allowed to perform volunteer or other work, approved 21 or issued a license, or allowed to retain a license or 22 approval by the Department of Human Resources, an employer, child care facility, adult care facility, or child placing 23 24 agency.

"(d) Child care facilities or adult Adult care
facilities exempt from Department of Human Resources licensing
shall not be required to comply with this chapter, but may

voluntarily collect and forward two complete acceptable sets 1 2 of fingerprints, the written consent, and nonrefundable fee from applicants or employees to the Department of Public 3 Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency to request a 4 5 criminal history background information check which shall be processed pursuant to this chapter. Licensed social workers 6 7 conducting home studies may also request a criminal history 8 background check which shall be processed pursuant to this 9 chapter. Provided, however, if a license-exempt child care 10 facility operated as part of a church ministry or religious 11 school does not choose to comply with this chapter on a 12 voluntary basis, then the employee or prospective employee of 13 the child care facility shall request a criminal history 14 background check, and the request shall be processed in the 15 same manner as for other employees or applicants under the 16 provisions of this chapter. The Department of Human Resources 17 shall, prior to the disbursement of any subsidized child care 18 funds, require all employees and applicants of legally operating child care facilities to submit verification of the 19 20 application for a criminal history background check and the 21 results thereof when obtained. Upon reasonable suspicion that 22 the individual has a criminal conviction or has not had a 23 criminal history background check conducted, the Department of 24 Human Resources shall have the right to require employees of 25 license-exempt child care or adult care facilities to submit each application for a criminal history background check and 26 the results thereof when obtained." 27

Section 3. Section 38-7-21 is added to the Code of
 Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§38-7-21.

A church, religious nonprofit entity, or religious 4 5 nonprofit school that has been operating a day care center or preschool program without a license prior to the effective 6 7 date of the act adding this section that chooses to become a licensed day care center under this chapter shall have 90 days 8 from the effective date of the act adding this section to come 9 10 into compliance with all licensing requirements of this chapter and related rules adopted by the department, except 11 the church, religious nonprofit entity, or religious nonprofit 12 13 school shall not be required to meet minimum standards for licensed day care centers or nighttime centers relating to 14 15 physical building design, size, and fixtures for existing 16 construction.

Section 4. A child care facility that is an integral part of a church or nonprofit religious school, other than a child care facility exempt from licensure under subsection (b) of Section 38-7-3, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended by this act, shall be licensed in accordance with Chapter 7, Title 38, Code of Alabama 1975, no later than August 1, 2019.

23 Section 5. This act shall become effective 24 immediately following its passage and approval by the 25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
