9	SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, each waterfowl season a
10	person must purchase an annual stamp from the judge
11	of probate or another agent authorized by the
12	Department of Conservation and Natural Resources in
13	order to hunt waterfowl. There is no provision in
14	current law for the issuance of a lifetime
15	waterfowl stamp.
16	This bill would provide for the department
17	to issue a lifetime waterfowl stamp and establish
18	the fees for a lifetime stamp. The bill would also
19	authorize cost-of-living adjustments for the
20	lifetime fees.

26	To amend Section 9-11-433, Code of Alabama 1975,
27	relating to the issuance of annual stamps for waterfowl

hunting; to provide for the issuance of lifetime waterfowl
stamps and to establish fees; and to authorize for adjustment
of the fees.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 9-11-433, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§9-11-433.

"(a) A stamp shall be issued to each hunting license applicant by the judge of probate or issuing officer of any county of the state or other authorized license agent as provided herein upon the payment of a fee of ten dollars (\$10). Each stamp shall be valid for the duration of one hunting season as established by the department. Stamps shall be available for sale prior to any waterfowl season, including any special season which may precede the regular season. The stamp fee provided in this subsection shall be subject to periodic adjustments by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources based on increases in the Consumer Price Index in the same manner as other fishing and hunting licenses and fees are adjusted pursuant to Section 9-11-68.

"(b) In lieu of an annual stamp, a lifetime
migratory waterfowl stamp may be purchased by or for
individuals meeting the residency requirements set out in
Section 9-11-44 for the following license fees:

"(1) Persons less than two years old, one hundred thirty dollars (\$130).

1	"(2) Persons age two through 11 years old, one
2	hundred seventy dollars (\$170).
3	"(3) Persons age 12 through 49 years, two hundred
4	ten dollars (\$210).
5	"(4) Persons age 50 years and above, one hundred
6	thirty dollars (\$130).
7	"(5) The stamp fee provided in this subsection may
8	be subject to periodic adjustments by the Department of
9	Conservation and Natural Resources upon approval of the
10	commissioner based on increases in the Consumer Price Index in
11	the same manner as other fishing and hunting licenses and fees
12	are adjusted pursuant to Section 9-11-68.
13	"(b) (c) The judge of probate, or issuing officer,
14	or other authorized license agent as provided herein shall be
15	allowed a fee of one dollar (\$1) for each license issued,
16	which issuing fee shall be in addition to the cost of the
17	stamp and shall be subject to adjustment as provided for in
18	Section 9-11-68. In counties where the judge of probate or
19	issuing officer is on the fee system, the issuing fee shall be
20	retained by the judge of probate or issuing officer, and in
21	counties where the judge of probate or issuing officer is on a
22	salary basis, the fee shall be paid into the county treasury
23	to the credit of the appropriate fund.
24	" $\frac{(c)}{(d)}$ Other license agents as authorized by the
25	Department of Conservation and Natural Resources may issue
26	migratory waterfowl stamps, provided the other authorized

license agents prepurchase sheets of stamps for resale at face

value plus the issuance fee provided herein. An agent shall

place an initial order for one or more sheets of 10 stamps

each for the license year. At the end of the license period,

the agent may return unsold stamps for a refund."

Section 2. This act shall become effective

immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
