8	MOURNING THE DEATH AND CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF THE
9	REVEREND BILLY GRAHAM, EVANGELIST TO THE WORLD.

11	WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the
12	death on February 21, 2018, of the Reverend Billy Graham of
13	Montreat, North Carolina, at the age of 99 years; and
14	WHEREAS, the Reverend Graham was born William
15	"Billy" Franklin Graham, Jr., on November 7, 1918, to William
16	Franklin, Sr. and Morrow Coffey Graham, in Charlotte, North
17	Carolina; and
18	WHEREAS, a graduate of Florida Bible Institute which
19	is now Trinity College of Florida; he received a Bachelor of
20	Arts Degree in Anthropology from Wheaton College in Wheaton,
21	Illinois, he was ordained to the ministry by Peniel Baptist
22	Church, Palatka, Florida, in 1939; and
23	WHEREAS, throughout his life, the Reverend Graham
24	preached the Gospel of Jesus Christ to more than 215 million
25	people who attended one of his more than 400 Crusades,
26	simulcasts and evangelistic rallies in more than 185 countries

and territories; he reached millions more through television, video, film, the internet, and 34 books; and

WHEREAS, in 2001, he comforted his country and the world when he spoke at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., following the September 11 terrorist attacks; at three global conferences held in Amsterdam, the Reverend Graham gathered some 23,000 evangelists from 208 countries and territories to train them to carry the message of Jesus Christ around the world; and

WHEREAS, during the week of his 95th birthday in 2013, the Reverend Graham delivered his final message via more than 480 television stations across the United States and Canada; more than 26,000 churches participated in this "My Hope" project, making it the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association's largest evangelistic outreach ever in North America; and

WHEREAS, at his final Crusade in June 2005 at Flushing Meadows Corona Park in New York, the Reverend Graham said, "I have one message: That Jesus Christ came, He died on a cross, He rose again, and He asked us to repent of our sins and receive Him by faith as Lord and Savior, and if we do, we have forgiveness of all our sins"; and

WHEREAS, in his autobiography, "Just As I Am," the Reverend Graham wrote that he felt God calling him to the ministry; the call came during a late-night walk on a golf course; "I got down on my knees at the edge of one of the greens, then I prostrated myself on the dewy turf, 'O God,' I

sobbed, 'if you want me to serve you, I will'; all the
surroundings stayed the same, no sign in the heavens, no voice
from above, but in my spirit I knew I had been called to the
ministry, and I knew my answer was yes"; and
WHEREAS, over the course of Reverend Graham's
ministry, he became a beloved minister to many citizens of the
State of Alabama, as well as the United States and all over

the world; and

great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his parents;
and his beloved wife of 64 years, Ruth McCue Bell Graham; and
WHEREAS, survivors include his sister, Jean Ford;
daughters, Virginia Leftwich "Gigi" Graham, Anne Morrow Graham
Lotz, Ruth Bell Graham, William Franklin Graham, III, and
Nelson Edman Graham; 19 grandchildren, and 41

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the death of the Reverend Billy Graham is recorded with deep sadness and with heartfelt sympathy to his family, whose grief is shared by many, and also with gratefulness and admiration for his ministry and message, bearing in mind Reverend Graham's oft used words: "Someday you will read or hear that Billy Graham is dead. Don't believe a word of it. I shall be more alive than I am now. I will just have changed my address. I will have gone into the presence of God."
