served his country in the United States Army from 1942 to
1944; and

WHEREAS, in 1956, Carl Elliott authored the Library Services Act, which brought mobile libraries (Bookmobiles) and continuing library service to millions of rural Americans; in 1958, he co-authored the National Defense Education Act, which has enabled more then 30 million college students nationwide to obtain student loans; and

9 WHEREAS, in addition to his law practice, Mr. 10 Elliott wrote books about local history, producing columns and 11 book reviews for area newspapers, and publishing books by 12 local authors; his books include five volumes of Annals of 13 Northwest Alabama, a history of Red Bay, Alabama, and seven 14 volumes on the history of area coal miners; and

15 WHEREAS, in 1990, Carl Elliott became the first 16 recipient of the John F. Kennedy Profiles in Courage Award in 17 recognition of his outstanding achievements; he was honored to 18 travel to Boston, Massachusetts, to accept the award from United States Senator Edward M. Kennedy; his autobiography, 19 20 The Cost of Courage: The Journey of An American Congressman, 21 published in 1992, has been reprinted by The University of 22 Alabama Press; and

23 WHEREAS, Representative Johnny Mack Morrow reflects 24 on the life Carl Elliott with the tribute, "My father, Grover 25 Morrow, was a boyhood friend of Carl Elliott. When Carl was 26 elected to Congress, I was 6 years old. Carl would often visit 27 our home and talk politics with my father while he was a

1 congressman. I would sit for long periods of time and listen 2 to these discussions. The base of my political ideology today 3 was definitely built and based upon these discussions between 4 my father and Carl. Carl lived his life helping the underdog 5 or assisting the 'least of these!'"; now therefore,
