16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
18	from the named funds for the 2019 fiscal year to the state
19	agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
20	expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all
21	monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
22	the Alabama Statutes.
23	For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for
24	expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals
25	for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is
26	intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in

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1 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the 2 following definitions shall be applicable.

3 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total4 of all funding sources.

5 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services 6 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be 7 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or 8 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended 9 only for such purposes.

10 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 11 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 12 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 13 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 14 expended only for such purposes.

15 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations 16 17 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes. 18 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by 19 20 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties. 21 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 22 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the

executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State,
for other functions of government, for debt service, and for
capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019,
to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such
other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much

thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-1 2 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 3 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 4 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-5 ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period 6 7 which has been or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment 8 due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in 9 10 which the pay date falls.

The Revenue Department shall not be limited in any way whatsoever in its ability to utilize or spend its full appropriation and all sums allowed to the Department of Revenue by acts of the Legislature as a charge for the collection of taxes or licenses. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Revenue utilize the appropriations made to it in this act to: (1) significantly reduce the amount of delinquent taxes owed to the state; (2) employ sufficient examiners and audit personnel to ensure that taxes owed to the state are collected accurately and timely; and (3) update its personal computers and related equipment to become more efficient in the collection of taxes owed to the state. During FY 2019, the Department shall report quarterly to the Chairs of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee and the Deputy Director of the Legislative Services Agency-Fiscal Division on all actions taken by the Department in furtherance of these goals. The reports shall include, but not be limited to: (1) the number and amount of delinquent taxes collected during the quarter and the number and amounts of delinquent taxes outstanding as of the end of the quarter; (2) the number of additional examiners and audit personnel employed during the quarter (not including examiners and audit personnel employed to replace personnel that retire

19 Section 3. In addition to the amounts otherwise 20 appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from 21 the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education 22 Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the 23 several State officials and employees are paid, such 24 additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a three 25 percent (3.0%) salary increase enacted in the 2018 Regular 26 Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section 27 from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$14,540,000 for 28 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. The Director of 29 Finance shall ensure that first priority shall be given to all

State General Fund payrolls, including the payroll of the 1 2 Legislature. State agencies shall receive additional allocations from the appropriation made in this section from 3 the State General Fund in amounts necessary to increase total 4 5 salaries paid from the State General Fund by three percent. The remainder of this appropriation from the State General 6 7 Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the State General Fund. 8

9 Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of 10 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 11 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to the various 12 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 13 on September 30, 2018, are hereby reappropriated to the 14 respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 15 2018.

Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

22 Section 6. In addition to all other appropriations 23 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally 24 appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or 25 litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. The 26 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving 27 revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the
House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate
Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval
of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein
shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through
41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-8, Code of
Alabama 1975.

Section 7. Except as may be herein otherwise 8 9 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in 10 lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the 11 12 maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 13 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 14 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 15 herein except as may be further provided for under this act, as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 16 17 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those 18 appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of 19 20 alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, 21 conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80, et 22 seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975. 23

24 Section 8. Any surplus remaining in any 25 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any 26 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 27 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

5 Section 9. In addition to appropriations herein made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or 6 7 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, including grants by the Congress of the United States, 8 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 9 10 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 11 12 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 13 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 14 15 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 16 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 17 18 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 19 20 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 21 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 22 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the 23 24 fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

25 Section 10. The Department of Examiners of Public 26 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 27 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 11. Upon certification to the Director of 8 9 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 10 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 11 12 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 13 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 14 15 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 16 17 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 18 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 19 not available for the court-ordered payments. 20

21 Section 12. All interest earned from funds paid into 22 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 23 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 24 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 25 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 26 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 27 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd

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Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are
 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous 3 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions 4 5 authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 6 7 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 8 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 9 10 appropriation or appropriations were made.

Section 14. The appropriations made herein to the 11 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 12 13 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 14 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 15 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 16 17 this act and receiving services from other governmental 18 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for 19 20 such services.

21 Section 15. All funds collected under Section 22 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date 23 of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2018 are hereby appropriated 24 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for 25 the administration of the examiner certification program 26 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of
 Alabama 1975.

Section 16. It is the intent of the Legislature that 3 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 4 5 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 2A of this act which 6 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 7 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 8 9 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of 10 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 1975. 11

12 Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the 13 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 14 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be 15 \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance 16 17 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned 18 fixed rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and 19 20 retired members.

21 Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that 22 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 23 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 24 Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, and the Deputy 25 Director of the Legislative Services Agency-Fiscal Division of 26 any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, 27 of any of the funds appropriated in this act. Section 19. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

8 Section 20. All laws or parts of laws, general, 9 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 10 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 11 expressly repealed.

Section 21. Each agency of the state funded through the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of this state without regard to sex or race.

Section 22. This act shall become effective October 17 1, 2018.
