BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
from the named funds for the 2019 fiscal year to the state
agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the

expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

10 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total11 of all funding sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

17 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 18 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 19 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 20 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 21 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

25 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
26 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
27 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

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1 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 2 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the 3 executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 4 5 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 6 7 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much 8 thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-9 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 10 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 11 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-12 13 ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period 14 which has been or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment 15 due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in 16 17 which the pay date falls.

It is the intent of the Legislature that all grants shall follow the standard and proper grant process and shall meet all departmental guidelines. Any other interest earned by the state from 6 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 7 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 8 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund. 9

10 Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions 11 authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 12 13 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 14 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 15 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 16 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 17 appropriation or appropriations were made.

The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 19 20 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 21 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 22 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 23 24 this act and receiving services from other governmental 25 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a 26 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services. 27

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Section 15. All funds collected under Section 1 2 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2018 are hereby appropriated 3 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for 4 5 the administration of the examiner certification program 6 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 7 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975. 8

9 Section 16. It is the intent of the Legislature that 10 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 2A of this act which 11 12 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 13 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 14 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 15 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of 16 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 17 1975.

18 Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 19 20 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be 21 \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year 22 ending September 30, 2019. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance 23 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned 24 fixed rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that 25 the Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and retired members. 26

Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, of any of the funds appropriated in this act.

8 Section 19. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 9 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 10 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 11 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 12 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 13 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 14 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

15 Section 20. All laws or parts of laws, general, 16 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 17 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 18 expressly repealed.

19 Section 21. Each agency of the state funded through 20 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 21 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 22 this state without regard to sex or race.

23 Section 22. This act shall become effective October24 1, 2018.
