12	WHEREAS, the XXIII Winter Olympic Games were held
13	February 9 to February 25, 2018, and the XII Winter Paralympic

16	WHEREAS, PyeongChang was selected as the host city
17	for the 2018 Winter Olympic Games on July 6, 2011; and
18	WHEREAS, the Winter Olympic Games were held in Korea
19	for the first time in 30 years after the Seoul Olympic Games
20	in 1988; and
21	WHEREAS, the world's best athletes competed on
22	Asia's center stage to launch new horizons of culture,
23	environment, geography, and economy in winter sports and
24	create a sustainable legacy for the Republic of Korea; and
25	WHEREAS, athletes taking part in the PyeongChang
26	2018 Winter Olympic Games competed in 102 events in 15 sport
27	disciplines, and athletes competing in the XII Winter

Paralympic Games will compete in the same number of events and disciplines; this year marked the first Winter Olympic Games with more than 100 gold medals; also, PyeongChang is the stage for the greatest number of women's and mixed events in the history of the Winter Olympic Games and Winter Paralympic Games; and

WHEREAS, the 2018 United States Olympic Team included approximately 240 athletes and featured a blend of veteran and new talent and fielded athletes in all 15 sport disciplines; and

WHEREAS, the United States Paralympic Team will participate in the events of Alpine Skiing, Nordic Skiing, Sled Hockey, Snowboarding, and Wheelchair Curling in the 2018 Winter Paralympic Games; and

WHEREAS, Christa Springs of Wetumpka, Alabama, and John Zimmerman, IV, of Homewood, Alabama, have the utmost distinction of serving as coaches in PyeongChang; and

WHEREAS, Alabama Korean Education and Economic Partnership, [AKEEP], whose missions provides multicultural diversity education, bridging the differences for economic prosperity, offers Korean language education to Alabama's K-12 students; and

WHEREAS, more than 26,000 Alabama Koreans reside in the State of Alabama, and more than 90 Korean companies along with the major Korean automotive manufacturer, Hyundai, provide more than 36,000 employments in the State of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, the Federation of Korean Associations in the SE USA represents more than 200,000 Korean Americans in Alabama, Georgia, North Carolina, and South Carolina; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we recognize and congratulate the Republic of Korea on being the host of the XXIII Winter Olympic Games and XII Winter Paralympic Games and wish the country success with the expectation that these events have contributed to peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula.
