15 WHEREAS, Mr. Brown earned his Masters Degree in 16 Mechanical Engineering and worked as Chief Engineer, Metric 17 Systems Corporation, Fort Walton Beach, Florida, and in 18 private practice in Guntersville until retirement; and

WHEREAS, his professional and civic affiliations included member of Air Commando Association, Retired Officers Association, Reserve Officers Association; he was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal and the Prisoner of War Medal; and
