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8	SYNOPSIS: This bill amends certain sections of the
9	Code of Alabama 1975, which provide for the
10	creation of a permanent joint transportation
11	standing committee that reviews the long-range plan
12	and the budgets of the Alabama Department of
13	Transportation.

16	TO BE ENTITLED
17	AN ACT
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19	Relating to the Permanent Joint Transportation
20	Committee; to amend Sections 29-2-1, 29-2-2, 29-2-3, 29-2-4,
21	29-2-6, and 29-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide for
22	technical corrections concerning the duties of the committee
23	as it relates to the Alabama Department of Transportation
24	long-range plan; to increase the number of members of the
25	Committee and specify their residency requirements; to provide
26	clarification of the long-range plan; and to provide
27	clarification of the Alabama Department of Transportation's

1 duties and information requirements to the Committee relating 2 to the long-range plan.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Sections 29-2-1, 29-2-2, 29-2-3, 29-2-4,
5 29-2-6, and 29-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read
6 as follows:

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"§29-2-1.

"The Legislature hereby finds and declares as 8 9 follows: A long-range program of highway development and 10 maintenance in Alabama (herein called "the state") is vital to the safety of the traveling public as well as the industrial 11 12 and agricultural growth and to the present and future 13 well-being of the citizens of the state; the highway system in 14 the state must be adequate to meet such expanding needs; the 15 highway construction, modification, maintenance, and administration to support such a system must should include 16 long-range planning, soundness in scope of the highway 17 18 program, efficient performance, and fiscal responsibility in both policy and planning; the use enactment of a long-range 19 20 highway program will further the judicious expenditure of 21 highway funds, will promote the public safety and convenience 22 and public safety, will enhance public confidence in the 23 responsible expenditure of public funds, and will result in 24 tangible benefits to the public by providing a sound program 25 to facilitate vehicular traffic and safety; such a long-range 26 program will establish continuity in highway construction, 27 modification, and maintenance programs, thereby enabling the

State of Alabama Department of Transportation (herein called 1 2 "ALDOT" or "the Transportation Department") to operate at maximum efficiency with a greater returns in highway benefits 3 for the amount of public funds expended; all citizens and 4 5 interested parties should be aware of how their highway dollars funds will be expended well as far in advance of such 6 7 the actual expenditures as possible; , and because changing of routes affect people's travel times and patterns as well as 8 9 property values, all plans for such changes should be 10 transparent and made known to all citizens simultaneously well in advance of their implementation; such a long-range program 11 12 requires advance consideration of priority of highway 13 construction and modification projects and of adequate budgets for highway construction, modification, maintenance, and 14 15 administration achieving an appropriate balance in highway decision making is an important goal; and, to the foregoing 16 17 ends, it is desirable to create a permanent joint 18 transportation committee of the Legislature which will develop 19 expertise pertaining to highway matters within both 20 legislative bodies and which will insure geographical balance 21 in highway decision making the development of highway plans and budgets for their implementation is a primary 22 23 responsibility of the Transportation Department working under 24 the direction of the Governor; appropriate legislative 25 oversight procedures are necessary to fulfill the goals set 26 forth above; a Joint Transportation Committee of the 27 Legislature will develop expertise pertaining to highway

1 <u>matters within both legislative bodies and will contribute</u> 2 <u>actively to the Legislature's deliberations with respect to</u> 3 <u>highway funding and plans; and now therefore, the creation of</u> 4 <u>such Joint Transportation Committee is appropriate and</u> 5 <u>desirable</u>. 6 <u>This article shall be liberally construed in order</u> 7 <u>to effect the purposes.</u>

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"§29-2-2.

9 "(a) There is hereby created a continuing permanent 10 joint transportation committee of the Legislature to be known as the "Joint Transportation Committee." The committee shall 11 12 consist of seven twelve members of the Senate appointed by the 13 President of the Senate and seven twelve members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of 14 15 Representatives, one senator and one house member to be a 16 resident of each present United States congressional district 17 in the state and one senator and one house member to be a 18 resident of each Alabama Department of Transportation region. Of the total membership, a minimum of two members shall be 19 20 from the Minority party.

"(b) The members that reside in the Alabama
Department of Transportation regions Members of the Joint
Transportation Committee shall be appointed within thirty days
of the effective date of this act; in subsequent years,
members of the Joint Transportation Committee shall be
appointed within five legislative days after the convening of
the first regular session after the election of each

Legislature. Members shall hold office during their terms as
 legislators and until their successors are appointed.
 Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the respective
 presiding officer. Appointees shall be residents of the
 congressional district where the vacancy exists made to
 fulfill the residency requirements outlined above.

7 "(c) The appointing authorities shall coordinate
8 their appointments to assure the committee membership is
9 inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban,
10 rural, and economic diversity of the state.

"§29-2-3.

12 "Within 10 days after members of the Joint 13 Transportation Committee are appointed as provided in this article, the committee shall convene at a place and time 14 15 designated by the President of the Senate in written notice 16 given to each member at least five days in advance or without 17 notice upon unanimous consent of the members of the Joint 18 Transportation Committee The Joint Transportation Committee shall meet the fourth Wednesday of January, April, July, and 19 20 October at 1:30 PM at the Alabama State House. At the second 21 quarterly meeting of each year, and at the initial meeting 22 during each session of the Legislature, the Joint 23 Transportation Committee shall elect from its membership a 24 chair and vice-chair which shall rotate between members from 25 the House and Senate. Special meetings of the Joint 26 Transportation Committee may be called by the chair by giving members of the committee 14 days notice when the Legislature 27

is out of session, and 24 hours notice if a meeting is called 1 on a legislative day or legislative committee day. Special 2 meetings may also be called by petition of a majority of the 3 members of the committee that includes the date and time of 4 5 the meeting and all members are given 24 hours notice. The Joint Transportation Committee shall meet, at the request of 6 its chair or as its members shall determine, in both cases 7 8 upon written notice at least five days in advance or without 9 notice upon unanimous consent of its membership; provided, 10 that the committee shall meet at least once each three months. Decisions of the Joint Transportation Committee may be made by 11 a majority of the members present and voting at any properly 12 13 convened meeting as long as a quorum is in attendance. A 14 quorum shall consist of any eight thirteen members. If less 15 than a quorum is present at any meeting the recommendations presented by ALDOT shall be deemed approved. or any 16 17 adjournment thereof, those members who are present may adjourn 18 the meeting from time to time and a majority vote of the 19 members present shall be sufficient, without any notice other 20 than by announcement at the meeting, to adjourn the meeting 21 from time to time until a quorum is in attendance. At any 22 adjourned meeting, any business may be transacted that might 23 have been transacted at the meeting as originally called 24 Should any member be absent from two meetings of the four quarterly meetings during any calendar year, they shall be 25 deemed to have forfeited their position and a replacement 26 27 shall be appointed by the respective appointing authority as

1	outlined herein. Upon the request of the Chair, the Secretary
2	of the Senate and the Clerk of the House shall provide
3	clerical assistance as the committee requires.
4	"§29-2-4.
5	"The powers and duties of the Joint Transportation
6	Committee shall be the following as follows:
7	"(1) It shall review and concur in a <u>and shall</u>
8	consider concurring with the long-range plan of the
9	Transportation Department as such plan exists at the date of
10	the meeting called for the purpose of reviewing the plan. The
11	"long-range plan" referred to herein is the Statewide
12	Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) maintained by ALDOT
13	for the purpose of complying with requirements of the Federal
14	Highway Administration, which plan is amended multiple times
15	each year for administrative as well as substantive reasons,
16	and which plan shall be constantly available on the ALDOT
17	website. A member of the Committee may propose an amendment to
18	the STIP provided that the proposed amendment is delivered in
19	writing to the Transportation Department by the close of
20	business of the fourth Wednesday after the draft plan is
21	presented to the Committee. The proposed amendment shall be
22	fiscally constrained within the funding category shown in the
23	draft STIP. The Department shall prepare the amendment and
24	deliver to each member of the Committee no later than the
25	fourth Wednesday of the month prior to the next quarterly
26	meeting. Should the Committee, by majority vote, accept the
27	proposed amendment, the amendment shall be delivered by the

Chair of the Committee to the Governor for consideration of 1 2 changing the STIP as presented by the Transportation Department. (five-year) federal-aid highway plan for proposed 3 highway construction of all highways on the state highway 4 5 system, which long-range plan shall commence with the fiscal year of the state beginning October 1, 1989. Prior to any 6 deviation from the intent of the five-year plan, the Joint 7 8 Transportation Committee shall review and concur in the 9 deviation, except commitments for highway projects necessary 10 for new or expanded industry. Commitments for these industry projects shall be included in the next quarterly report by the 11 12 Department of Transportation. The plan shall be updated 13 annually. The plans in appropriate form shall be made 14 available to all government agencies and all members of the 15 public and news media. 16 "(2) The update of the Transportation Department's

annual fund allocation plan shall be presented to the Joint 17 18 Transportation Committee at the third quarterly meeting of each year. The review and consideration of concurrence in the 19 20 annual update of the five-year highway plan shall be 21 accomplished by the Joint Transportation Committee prior to 22 September 1 no later than the last quarterly meeting of each year. Failure of the Joint Transportation Committee to concur 23 24 in the annual update will not prevent the Department of 25 Transportation Department from proceeding with any project. "(3) The Transportation Department's requested 26

27 budget for the following fiscal year shall be presented to the

Joint Transportation Committee at the last guarterly meeting 1 2 of the year. It shall review the budget for highway 3 construction, maintenance, operation, and administration of the Department of Transportation proposed by the 4 5 Transportation Department on an annual basis, which budget 6 review shall be reviewed completed not later than the 7 fifteenth legislative day of each annual session of the 8 Legislature first quarterly meeting of each year. The Joint 9 Transportation Committee shall report on the budget requests 10 of the Transportation Department to the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance and Taxation 11 12 General Fund Committee and may make recommendations about the 13 budget to the committees. 14 "(4) An in-progress draft of the Annual Report outlined in Section 23-1-35, Code of <u>Alabama 1975 shall be</u> 15 16 presented to the Joint Transportation Committee at the first quarterly meeting of each year. All comments and input from 17 18 members of the Joint Transportation Committee shall be 19 delivered to the Transportation Department within 30 days of 20 the first quarterly meeting to allow consideration by the 21 Transportation Department prior to publishing. 22 "(5) The Transportation Department shall prepare and 23 submit for review by the Joint Transportation Committee a 24 long-range plan for the Department at the first quarterly 25 meeting of the year. The plan shall include a narrative of the condition of the Transportation Department as well as forward 26 looking challenges and opportunities. The intent of this 27

requirement is to allow the Joint Transportation Committee to assist in avoiding future problems and challenges and to assist in the development of goals for the Transportation Department. This plan may be incorporated into the Annual Report as required by Section 23-1-35, Code of Alabama 1975 or be prepared as a separate document.

7 "(4) (6) It shall issue a report to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, House of Representatives, and Senate, and 8 public within 30 days of the first quarterly meeting the first 9 10 10 legislative days of each annual regular legislative 11 session, comparing actual performance of the Department of 12 Transportation Department in terms of highway construction, 13 maintenance, and costs of the same, to the original plan for 14 the immediate preceding fiscal year as well as the five 15 preceding fiscal years. It shall also make this report available to the public within forty (40) days of the first 16 17 quarterly meeting.

"(5) (7) It shall recommend to the Governor
 necessary funding for Department of <u>future</u> Transportation
 <u>Department</u> budgets to the extent necessary beyond funds
 already provided by law.

"(6) (8) It may retain the services of outside consultants, if necessary, and consult with other groups and individuals, including public interest groups, interested individuals, and appropriate departments of the University of Alabama, Auburn University, and other state <u>educational</u> institutions.

"(7) (9) It may hold public hearings, shall make 1 2 diligent inquiry and a full examination of the long-range future highway needs of the state, and shall file all reports 3 of its findings and recommendations with both houses of the 4 5 Legislature and with the Governor. "(8) (10) It may call witnesses and do all things 6 7 necessary or convenient in connection with and all things incidental to performance of the foregoing duties and powers. 8 9 "(9) (11) In performing its functions, the Joint 10 Transportation Committee shall take into consideration, in determining reviewing plans for highway construction and 11 maintenance, among other factors all of the following: 12 13 "a. Commuter benefits in the form of direct savings to working men and women traveling to and from their jobs in 14 15 the state $\overline{\cdot}$; "b. Industrial and agricultural growth-; 16 17 "c. Transportation safety-; 18 "d. Ecological impacts of transportation projects-; "e. Recreation and tourism-; 19 20 "f. Traffic density-; 21 "g. Implications on the routing of school buses; 22 "h. Implications on the operation of public safety 23 and first responder vehicles; and "i. Priority to projects in a location with an 24 25 independent local assessment. "§29-2-6. 26

"The Department of Transportation Department shall 1 2 cooperate with the Joint Transportation Committee and shall prepare or cause to be prepared and furnished to the Joint 3 Transportation Committee, by July 1 the third quarterly 4 5 meeting of each year, the current long-range five-year federal-aid highway plan, STIP for proposed highway 6 7 construction and any other reports, disclosures, information, 8 or data requested by Joint Transportation Committee. and the 9 Department of Transportation's The Transportation Department's 10 proposed annual budgets, all as referred to in Section 29-2-4 for the next fiscal year shall be prepared and furnished to 11 the Joint Transportation Committee by the last quarterly 12 13 meeting of each year. The Department of Transportation 14 Department shall include in its current annual work program 15 sufficient projects to insure the complete utilization of all 16 federal and state funds. It shall make available the books and 17 records of the Department of Transportation Department 18 necessary for the Joint Transportation Committee to perform its functions and shall report to it quarterly on the 19 20 performance of the Department of Transportation Department for 21 the preceding fiscal quarter of the state and its proposed 22 projects and plans for the current fiscal year thereof. The Transportation Department shall maintain the STIP in 23 24 accordance with requirements set forth by the Federal Highway Administration. Additionally, the Transportation Department 25 26 shall include narrative language for each project in the STIP describing in detail the scope of the project and the reasons 27

1 for its placement in the STIP. Whenever the plan is amended 2 for any reason, the Transportation Department shall, within 3 seven calendar days of such amendment: (1) update the ALDOT website to disclose the change(s) made to the plan and (2) 4 5 notify, in writing, the chair of the Joint Transportation Committee of the change(s) made together with appropriate 6 7 explanation of the change(s). Upon written request from the 8 chair of the Joint Transportation Committee, the 9 Transportation Department shall provide copies of the notice 10 to all members of the Joint Transportation Committee.

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"§29-2-8.

"All bills originating in either house pertaining to 12 13 highway projects transportation under the jurisdiction of the 14 Department of Transportation Department, its budget, and all 15 other matters of highway planning, construction, modification, 16 maintenance, operation, or administration shall be referred to 17 reviewed by the Joint Transportation Committee for its 18 recommendations and approval, which recommendations and 19 approval shall be given due consideration by the committees of 20 each house of the Legislature in acting on any related 21 legislation. Absent a recommendation from the Joint Transportation Committee, said committees shall proceed with 22 their consideration of legislation." 23

24 Section 2. Section 2. This act shall become 25 effective immediately following its passage and approval by 26 the Governor, or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
