24	TO BE ENTITLED
25	AN ACT
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1 Relating to public health; to authorize the 2 Department of Public Health to provide education and services regarding care for individuals with Alzheimer's disease, 3 dementia, or related diseases to those individuals, their 4 5 families, and the general public; to repeal Sections 22-50-70, 22-50-71, 22-50-72, 22-50-73, and 22-50-74, Code of Alabama 6 7 1975, to remove the responsibility and authority to do so from the Department of Mental Health; and to provide for funding. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 9 10 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Alabama Alzheimer's and Dementia Education, Care and 11 12 Training Act. 13 Section 2. The purposes of this act are: (1) To enable Alabamians with Alzheimer's disease, 14 15 dementia, or related diseases to live with dignity in their homes or community for as long as possible. 16 17 (2) To develop services that follow individuals with 18 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases and 19 maintain their independence in the community. (3) To provide appropriate services for Alabamians 20 21 with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases residing in both rural and urban settings. 22 23 (4) To emphasize and implement cost-efficient, 24 low-technology, high-yield services that can currently benefit 25 thousands of Alabama citizens. 26 (5) To allow Alabamians to pay for services based on their individual resources. 27

Section 3. (a) Subject to Section 5, the Department of Public Health is authorized to develop educational programs and services concerning Alzheimer's disease, dementia, and related diseases. These programs and services shall be offered to individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases, the families of these individuals, and the general public.

8 (b)(1) The department may provide instructors to 9 train and provide support to each of the following:

a. Members of the families of individuals with
 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases.

b. Health care providers who provide care for
individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar
diseases at the home of the individual or a member of the
family of the individual, or a similar residential location.

16 c. Other caregivers who provide care for individuals 17 with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases at the 18 home of the affected individual or a member of the family of 19 the individual, or similar residential location.

(2) These instructors may provide technical
assistance, training, support, and advice that will accomplish
both of the following:

a. Encourage the providing of long-term care for
 such individuals in the home of the individual, or a member of
 the family of the individual, or a similar residential
 location.

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b. Reduce health care costs to the state, the family
 of the affected individual, and health care facilities.

3 Section 4. The Department of Public Health may adopt
4 rules to implement this act.

5 Section 5. (a) The Legislature is authorized to 6 appropriate funding to establish and implement the 7 requirements of this act and to maintain the programs and 8 services required by this act.

9 (b) The Department of Public Health is authorized to 10 implement the requirements of this act to the extent funding 11 is provided.

12 (c) The department may accept gifts, grants, and 13 donations offered in support of the services established by 14 this act.

(d) The department may assess reasonable fees from recipients of the services provided by this act, if the recipient is able to pay for the services. If the recipient is able to pay a portion of a fee, the department shall collect that portion from the recipient. All fees collected shall be used by the department for the purposes of this act.

Section 6. Sections 22-50-70, 22-50-71,
 22-50-72, 22-50-73, and 22-50-74, Code of Alabama 1975,
 relating to dementia education and training, are repealed.

24 Section 7. This act shall become effective on 25 October 1, 2019, following its passage and approval by the 26 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
