5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the
7	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and
8	shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a
9	majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in
10	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution
11	of Alabama of 1901, as amended:
12	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
13	"(a)(1) The governor Governor shall have power to
14	grant reprieves and commutations to persons under sentence of
15	death.
16	"(2) The power to grant a commutation provided for
17	in subdivision (1) may not be exercised unless the Governor
18	provides a minimum of 30 days' written notice that the
19	Governor is considering granting the commutation. The notice
20	shall be provided to all of the following:
21	"a. The Attorney General.
22	"b. The victim's immediate family, or if there is no
23	immediate family, the victim's next of kin.
24	"c. The judge who presided over the trial of the
25	person under sentence of death; provided, if the judge is no
26	longer serving, the notice shall be given to the presiding
27	judge of the circuit.

1	"d. The district attorney of the county in which the
2	person under sentence of death was convicted.
3	"e. If the crime which resulted in the sentence of
4	death was committed in the police jurisdiction of a
5	municipality, the chief of police of the municipality, if any.
6	"f. The sheriff of the county in which the person
7	under sentence of death was convicted.
8	"g. If the crime which resulted in the sentence of
9	death was committed in a county different from the county of
10	conviction, the district attorney and sheriff of the county in
11	which the crime was committed.
12	"h. The Crime Victims Compensation Commission, or
13	its successor.
14	"(b) The legislature <u>Legislature</u> shall have power to
15	provide for and to regulate the administration of pardons,
16	paroles, remission of fines and forfeitures, and may authorize
17	the courts having criminal jurisdiction to suspend sentence
18	and to order probation.
19	"(c) No pardon shall relieve from civil and
20	political disabilities unless specifically expressed in the
21	pardon."

23	Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
24	shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the
25	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284
26	and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of

1 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 2 state. Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 3 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 4 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 5 6 following description of the substance or subject matter of 7 the proposed constitutional amendment: "Proposing an amendment to Amendment 38 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 124 9 10 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, relating to the authority of the Governor 11 12 to grant reprieves and commutations to persons under sentence 13 of death; to require the Governor to give a minimum of 30 14 days' written notice to certain persons prior to granting a 15 commutation to a person under a sentence of death. "Proposed by Act ____." 16 This description shall be followed by the following 17 18 language:
