8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, there is no prohibition
9		against smoking tobacco products in a motor vehicle
10		when a child is also riding in the vehicle.
11		This bill would prohibit smoking tobacco
12		products in a motor vehicle when a child aged 14
13		years and under is also riding in the vehicle.
14		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
15		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
16		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
17		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
18		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
19		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
20		becoming effective with regard to a local
21		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
22		unless: it comes within one of a number of
23		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
24		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates
25		funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
26		the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be 1 2 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 3 the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

To prohibit the smoking of tobacco products in motor vehicles when a child aged 14 years and under is present in the vehicle; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) It is unlawful for a person to smoke a tobacco product in a motor vehicle, whether in motion or at rest, in which a child aged 14 years and under is a passenger.

(b) For purposes of this section, smoke has the same meaning as smoking as defined in Section 22-15A-3, Code of

Alabama 1975, and tobacco product has the same meaning as defined in Section 28-11-2, Code of Alabama 1975.

3 (c) A violation of this section is punishable by a
4 fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) for each
5 violation.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
