9 A BILL  
10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT  
12

13 To alter, rearrange, and extend the boundary lines  
14 and corporate limits of the City of Bay Minette in Baldwin  
15 County.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

17 Section 1. The boundary lines and corporate limits  
18 of the City of Bay Minette in Baldwin County are altered,  
19 rearranged, and extended to include within the corporate  
20 limits of the municipality, in addition to the lands now  
21 included, all of the following territory:

22 Commencing at a Railroad Spike at the locally  
23 accepted Southeast Corner of Section 22, Township 2 South,  
24 Range 3 East, Baldwin County, Alabama; thence North 00°07'05"  
25 East, a distance of 2,182.15 feet to a point; thence West, a  
26 distance of 30.00 feet to a set 5/8 inch capped rebar on the  
27 Westerly right of way of County 57 being the point of

1 beginning; thence South 89°46'05" West, a distance of 735.62  
2 feet to a set capped rebar; thence South 00°10'10" West, a  
3 distance 684.09 feet to a set 5/8 inch capped rebar; thence  
4 South 89°46'05" West, a distance of 1,324.74 feet to a set 5/8  
5 inch capped rebar; thence North 00°10'10" East, a distance of  
6 734.09 feet to a set 5/8 inch capped rebar; thence North  
7 89°46'05" East a distance of 2060.31 feet to a set 5/8 inch  
8 capped rebar on said right of way; thence South 00°07'05" West  
9 along said right of way a distance of 50.00 feet to the point  
10 of beginning.

11 Section 2. In accordance with Section 11-42-6(b) of  
12 the Code of Alabama 1975, a map showing what territory is  
13 proposed to be annexed to the City of Bay Minette is on file  
14 in the office of the Judge of Probate in Baldwin County,  
15 Alabama, and the map is open to the inspection of the public.

16 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the  
17 first day of the third month following its passage and  
18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
