6 WHEREAS, we take great pride and pleasure in
7 commending the National Boys and Girls Clubs of America on the
8 occasion of celebrating National Boys and Girls Clubs of
9 America Week, April 8-12, 2019; and

10 WHEREAS, Boys and Girls Clubs of America wants every
11 child in America to be in a safe, constructive environment
12 when they are not at home or in school; and

13 WHEREAS, every day, over 148,000 youths in Alabama
14 leave school with nowhere to go, and risk being unsupervised,
15 unguided, and unsafe; fortunately, Boys and Girls Clubs of
