Office in San Diego, California; from 1963 to 1965, he served 1 2 as Resident Project Manager for the Pegasus Meteroid Detection Satellite Project in Bladensburg, Maryland; from 1965 to 1969, 3 he served as Chief of the Center's Saturn Program Resident 4 Office at the Kennedy Space Center; from 1969 to 1973, he served as an assistant to the Technical Deputy Director of 7 Marshall; in 1974, he became Program Manager of the Spacelab Program Office, where he was responsible for NASA's work with the European Space Agency in the development of Spacelab, a multipurpose reusable laboratory for Earth orbital science activities; in 1980, he served as the Deputy Director of Marshall; from July 1989 to January 1994, he served as 12 13 Director of the NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Alabama; and 14
