11 that news is received of the death of Mrs. Mildred Delaine
12 Black; and

13 WHEREAS, the passing of Mrs. Black leaves a void in
14 the lives of her loving family, many friends, and the entire
15 community, where she was highly regarded; and

16 WHEREAS, Mrs. Black was a native of Sumter County;
17 she received her education in the public schools of Sumter
18 County and her Bachelor of Science Degree from Alabama State
19 University and her Master of Education Degree from Tuskegee
20 University; and

21 WHEREAS, she retired from Livingston High School
22 after teaching for 40 years; she worked as a cosmetologist for
23 more than 50 years; and

24 WHEREAS, Mrs. Black is the author of "Twelve Plus: A
25 Biography of Lawrence Delaine," "The Kinterbish Connection,"
26 "Journey of 61 Years," and "Mildred Moments"; and

1 WHEREAS, a member of the religious community, she
2 was active in the Grants Chapel CME Church, where she taught
3 the women's Sunday School Class; she was a former member of
4 the Stewardess Board and was active with the Board of
5 Christian Education, the choir, class leader and president of
6 the Missionary Society; and

7 WHEREAS, Mrs. Black was active in many professional
8 organizations including, Sumter County Association of
9 Classroom Teachers, District VI Director of the State Council
10 of the Social Studies, member of the Rural Education Committee
11 of the National Social Studies, and the Legislative Club; and

12 WHEREAS, Mrs. Black was preceded in death by her
13 husband, the Honorable Lucius Black, Sr., an esteemed public
14 servant who served in the Alabama House of Representatives and
15 as a dedicated educator; and

16 WHEREAS, survivors include her children, Urey Black,
17 Lucius Black, Jr., and Don Black; and a host of other
18 relatives and friends; and

19 WHEREAS, although her presence will be greatly
20 missed, the memory of Mrs. Black will be cherished in the
21 hearts of all who knew and loved her; now therefore,

22 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
23 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the death of Mrs. Mildred
24 Delaine Black is recorded with deep sadness, and this
