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8	URGING THAT PRESIDENT TRUMP RELEASE HIS TAX RETURNS
9	TO THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS AND THE AMERICAN PUBLIC.
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11	WHEREAS, according to the Tax History Project, every
12	President since Gerald Ford has disclosed his tax information
13	to the public; and
14	WHEREAS, tax returns provide an important baseline
15	disclosure; they contain information highly relevant to an
16	individual's qualifications to hold the highest office in this
17	nation, including whether the candidate paid taxes, what they
18	own, what they have borrowed, whether they have made
19	charitable contributions, and whether they have taken
20	advantage of tax loopholes; and
21	WHEREAS, disclosure of the President's tax returns
22	could aid those investigating Russian electoral influence in
23	determining if there was, in fact, any undue influence in the
24	2016 election; the President's financial ties to the Russian
25	Federation and Russian citizens, including debts owed; whether
26	he shares any partnership ventures, equity interest, joint

1 ventures, or licensing agreements with Russia or Russian 2 entities; and WHEREAS, President Trump's close advisors, including 3 Carter Page, Paul Manafort, Roger Stone, and General Michael 4 5 Flynn have been under investigation for their ties to the Russian Federation; 6 7 WHEREAS, a Russian Deputy Foreign Minister told Interfax, a Russian Media Outlet, on September 10, "There were 8 contacts" with Donald Trump's 2016 campaign; this has been 9 10 corroborated by American news reports that members of President Trump's inner circle were in contact with senior 11 Russian officials throughout the 2016 campaign; and 12 13 WHEREAS, if there was indeed no undue influence on President Trump or his 2016 presidential campaign, the release 14 15 of tax returns could afford the President an opportunity to 16 prove his innocence; and 17 WHEREAS, the Emoluments Clause was included in the 18 United States Constitution for the express purpose of preventing federal officials from accepting any present, 19 20 emolument, or titles from any prince or foreign state; and 21 WHEREAS, according to a 2016 candidate filing with 22 the Federal Election Commission, President Trump holds 564 23 financial positions in companies located around the world; and 24 WHEREAS, against the advice of ethics attorneys and 25 the Office of Government Ethics, President Trump has refused 26 to divest ownership stakes in his businesses; President Trump

earned \$434 million during 2018, much of which was derived

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from his ownership of hotels in which foreign dignitaries and business representatives conveniently prefer to lodge when hoping for an audience with the President; and

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WHEREAS, according to the Washington Post, the Trump International Hotel in Washington, D.C. has hired a Director of Diplomatic Sales to generate high-price business among foreign leaders and diplomatic delegations; and

WHEREAS, the most-signed petition on the White House website calls for the release of the President's tax returns and information to verify compliance with the Emoluments Clause; 1,114,870 American citizens have signed that petition as of this date; and

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the United States House of Representatives Ways and Means Committee on Taxation and the Senate Finance Committee had the authority to request the President's tax returns under Section 6103 of the Internal Revenue Service Code; the Joint Committee on Taxation reviewed the tax returns of President Richard Nixon in 1974 and made the information public; and

WHEREAS, the House Ways and Means Committee used Internal Revenue Code Section 6103 authority in 2014 to make public the confidential information of 51 taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Assembly passed legislation on May 22, 2019, to require the state's tax commissioner to provide New York state tax returns to Congress upon request by the House Ways and Means Committee, clearly

signalling the state's agreement to release the tax returns of one of its residents; and

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WHEREAS, the American people have the right to know whether or not their President is operating under conflicts of interest relating to international affairs, tax returns, government contracts, or otherwise; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That this body hereby respectfully
requests that the Office of the President of the United States
immediately release the tax return information of President
Donald J. Trump for the tax years 2006-2016 for review in
closed executive session by the United States House of
Representatives Committee on Ways and Means as provided by
Section 6103 of the Internal Revenue Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this body requests that the Ways and Means Committee vote on releasing the information to the full House of Representatives and the American public.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this body supports transparency in government and the long-standing tradition of Presidents and presidential candidates disclosing their tax returns.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be provided to the Alabama Congressional Delegation, the United States House of Representatives Committee on Ways and Means, the Joint Tax Committee of the United States Congress, and the President of the United States, so that the sentiments of this body may be known.
