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8 SYNOPSIS: This bill would propose an amendment to the
9 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to establish the
10 Alabama Court Cost Commission and provide for its
11 membership; require the commission to review all
12 existing laws providing for the imposition of a
13 court cost to determine if the court cost is
14 reasonably related to the court system and if the
15 amount imposed is reasonably related to the amount
16 expended in adjudicating the matter in question;
17 require the commission to provide a recommendation
18 to the Legislature as to whether existing laws
19 providing for a court cost or the distribution of a
20 court cost should be amended, repealed, or left
21 unchanged; and prohibit the introduction of
22 legislation to propose a new or modify an existing
23 court cost unless first submitted to the commission
24 for review.

1 AN ACT

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3 Relating to courts; to propose an amendment to the
4 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to establish the Alabama
5 Court Cost Commission and provide for its membership; to
6 require the commission to review all existing laws providing
7 for the imposition of a court cost to determine if the court
8 cost is reasonably related to the court system and if the
9 amount imposed is reasonably related to the amount expended in
10 adjudicating the matter in question; to require the commission
11 to provide a recommendation to the Legislature as to whether
12 existing laws providing for a court cost or the distribution
13 of a court cost should be amended, repealed, or left
14 unchanged; and prohibit the introduction of legislation to
15 propose a new or modify an existing court cost unless first
16 submitted to the commission for review.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

18 Section 1. The following amendment to the
19 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and
20 shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a
21 majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in
22 accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution
23 of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

24 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

25 Section 1. As used in this amendment, the term
26 "court cost" means money charged by a court to parties in a
27 case, including, but not limited to, civil, criminal,

1 juvenile, or traffic cases, as required by law in connection
2 with the filing, processing, or other action of the court in
3 the administration of that case. The term does not include
4 costs in probate court cases, court-imposed restitution, or
5 punitive fines established by law for the violation of a
6 criminal law.

7 Section 2. (a) The Alabama Court Cost Commission is
8 established. The membership of the commission shall consist of
9 all of the following:

10 (1) One member of the House Judiciary Committee,
11 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

12 (2) One member of the Senate Judiciary Committee,
13 appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

14 (3) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, or
15 another justice of that court appointed by the Chief Justice.

16 (4) The Administrative Director of Courts, or a
17 representative from the Administrative Office of Courts
18 appointed by the director.

19 (5) One circuit judge of the state, appointed by the
20 Circuit Judges Association.

21 (6) One district judge of the state, appointed by
22 the District Judges Association.

23 (7) One municipal judge of the state, appointed by
24 the Municipal Judges Association section of the Alabama League
25 of Municipalities.

26 (8) One circuit clerk of the state, appointed by the
27 Circuit Clerks Association.

1 (9) One member in good standing of the Alabama State
2 Bar, appointed by that body.

3 (b) The appointing authorities shall make every
4 effort to coordinate their appointments to assure commission
5 membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender,
6 geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state
7 without regard to political affiliation.

8 (c) The chair of the commission shall be the Chief
9 Justice of the Supreme Court of Alabama, or his or her
10 appointee from that court. The commission shall elect a
11 vice-chair and a secretary from among its members.

12 (d) (1) Each legislative member of the commission
13 shall be entitled to his or her legislative compensation, per
14 diem, and travel expenses for each day the member attends a
15 meeting in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution
16 of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 49.01 of the
17 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,
18 as amended.

19 (2) Members of the commission shall be entitled to
20 reimbursement for their actual and necessary expenses,
21 including travel, lodging, and meals, while traveling on
22 official business of the commission or attending its meetings.

23 (e) The Legislative Services Agency shall provide
24 assistance to the commission as the commission requests.

25 (f) The chair of the commission may apply for grants
26 and other assistance from any public or private entity and may
27 take any necessary steps to secure grants or other assistance.

1 Section 3. (a) The Alabama Court Cost Commission
2 shall review each existing law providing for the imposition of
3 a court cost or the manner in which those costs are
4 distributed or earmarked to determine if the court cost is
5 reasonably related to the court system and if the amount
6 imposed is reasonably related to the amount expended in
7 adjudicating the matter in question. The review of each law
8 shall include a recommendation to the Legislature as to
9 whether the law providing for the imposition of the court cost
10 or the manner in which it is distributed or earmarked should
11 be amended, repealed, or left unchanged.

12 (b) Proposed legislation providing for a new court
13 cost or amending an existing court cost may not be introduced
14 unless the proposed legislation is submitted in writing to the
15 Alabama Court Cost Commission, the Clerk of the House of
16 Representatives, and the Secretary of the Senate no later than
17 30 calendar days prior to the first day of the legislative
18 session at which the proposed legislation is to be introduced.

19 (c) The Alabama Court Cost Commission shall review
20 proposed legislation submitted under subsection (b) to make a
21 recommendation to the Legislature as to whether the court cost
22 is reasonably related to the operation of the courts or the
23 court system and whether the amount of the proposed court cost
24 is proportionate to the amount expended in adjudicating the
25 matter in question. The commission shall submit a report on
26 the findings of the commission to the Clerk of the House and

1 the Secretary of the Senate not later than the third
2 legislative day of the legislative session.

3 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
4 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the
5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284
6 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
7 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this
8 state.

9 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
10 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
11 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
12 following description of the substance or subject matter of
13 the proposed constitutional amendment:

14 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of
15 Alabama of 1901, establishing the Alabama Court Cost
16 Commission and providing for its membership; requiring the
17 commission to review all existing laws providing for the
18 imposition of a court cost to determine if the court cost is
19 reasonably related to the court system and if the amount
20 imposed is reasonably related to the amount expended in
21 adjudicating the matter in question; requiring the commission
22 to provide a recommendation to the Legislature as to whether
23 existing laws providing for a court cost should be amended,
24 repealed, or left unchanged; and prohibiting the introduction
25 of legislation to propose a new or modify an existing court
26 cost unless first submitted to the commission for review.
