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Section 1. Notwithstanding Section 12-1-1, Code of Alabama 1975, or any other provision of Title 12, Code of Alabama 1975, or any rule of the Alabama Rules of Appellate Procedure, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Chairs of the House or Senate Judiciary Committees, or the Legislative Council may file a brief of an amicus curiae without leave of court at any time prior to the court's issuance of the certificate of judgment in any appeal.

Section 2. It is the intent of the Legislature, pursuant to Section 6.11 of Amendment 328 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 150 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 as amended, that this act supersede any inconsistent rule of appellate procedure adopted by the Alabama Supreme Court.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
