16	individual holding an out-of-state certification as a coal
17	mine foreman or a coal mine fire boss may temporarily serve as
18	a coal mine foreman or coal mine fire boss if that individual
19	otherwise meets the requisite requirements for the position;
20	and to revise the amount of time during which a temporary coal
21	mine foreman or coal mine fire boss may serve in the position.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Sections 25-9-11, 25-9-12, and 25-9-17,
24	Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
25	<b>"</b> §25-9-11.
26	"(a) Each applicant for a mine foreman's certificate
27	of competency shall satisfy all of the following requirements

be at least 23 years old and be a citizen of the United States

or, if not a citizen of the United States, a person who is

legally present in the United States with appropriate

documentation from the federal government, and shall satisfy

one of the following:

- "(1) Be a citizen of the United States or, if not a citizen of the United States, a person who is legally present in the United States with appropriate documentation from the federal government. Have had at least four years of practical mining experience.
- years of practical experience in or around coal mines and hold a bachelor level degree in mining engineering, geology, or a related field of study from a school accredited by the American Association of Universities, a successor organization, or by a national or regional accrediting agency that is recognized by the Secretary of the United States

  Department of Education.
- "(3) Have had at least two years and six months of practical mining experience in or around a coal mine and a bachelor level degree in any field of engineering other than mining engineering.
- "(3) Have had four years practical mining experience or have had three years practical experience in or around coal mines and be a graduate of a school accredited by the American Association of Universities or have satisfactorily completed an associate degree program in mine technology at an approved

state trade school or university. Have had at least three

years of practical experience in or around coal mines and hold

an associate level degree in engineering, geology, or a

related field of study from a school accredited by the

American Association of Universities, a successor

organization, or by a national or regional accrediting agency

that is recognized by the Secretary of the United States

Department of Education.

"(4) Present (b) Each applicant must also submit
with his or her application an affidavit of his or her meeting
reflecting that he or she has met the foregoing requirements
described in this section and of attesting to his or her good
moral character and known temperate habits, which. This
affidavit shall be signed by three reputable citizens, at
least one of whom shall be the holder of a mine foreman's
certificate.

"(5) Present with his or her application an affidavit that he or she is not a member of any political party or organization that advocates the overthrow of the government of the United States by force.

"(a) Each applicant for a fire boss's certificate of competency shall meet the same qualifications as those for a mine foreman; except that three years' practical experience in or around coal mines is substituted for the requirements of subdivision (3) of Section 25-9-11, and at least one of the persons signing the affidavit shall be holder of a fire boss's

1	or a mine foreman's certificate. be at least 22 years old and		
2	be a citizen of the United States or, if not a citizen of the		
3	United States, a person who is legally present in the United		
4	States with appropriate documentation from the federal		
5	government, and shall satisfy one of the following:		
6	"(1) Have had at least three years of practical

affidavit shall be signed by three reputable citizens, at

least one of whom shall be the holder of a mine foreman's

certificate.

"\$25-9-17.

"(a) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person shall act as fire boss in any coal mine in this state unless he or she is in possession of a fire boss's certificate of competency. Anyone holding a mine foreman's certificate of competency may serve as fire boss. Whenever any exigency arises by which or a mine foreman's certificate of competency.

"(b) If it is impossible for any an operator, owner, or lessee to secure the immediate service of a certified mine foreman or fire boss, he or she may employ a person, who has the same qualifications by experience, concurred in by the chief or mine inspector delegated by the chief, to act as temporary mine foreman or fire boss for a period not to exceed 15 days holds a valid underground coal mine foreman certification issued by another state, has worked in an underground mine in Alabama for at least 30 calendar days, and who meets the qualifications to work as a mine foreman in this state, as concurred in by the chief, or mine inspector delegated by the chief, to act as a temporary mine foreman or fire boss until the date of the next mine foreman examination that the person is eligible to take.

1	" <u>(c)</u> The requirements for a temporary mine foreman
2	or fire boss shall be no more severe stringent than those
3	contained in federal regulations."
4	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
5	first day of the third month following its passage and
6	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
