20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited
22	as the Roderic Deshaun Scott Seat Belt Safety Act.
23	Section 2. Section 32-5B-4 of the Code of Alabama
24	1975, is amended to read as follows:
25	"§32-5B-4.
26	"(a) (1) Each front seat occupant of a passenger car
27	manufactured with safety belts in compliance with Federal

- Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 208 shall have a safety belt properly fastened about his <u>or her</u> body at all times when the vehicle is in motion.
 - "(2) An adult occupant of a passenger car in violation of subdivision (1) shall be the proper person to be charged with the violation.

- (3) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, a violation of this section in any seat other than a front seat of a vehicle shall be a secondary violation after a lawful stop of the vehicle based on probable cause of another violation of law and the issuance of a citation or warrant of arrest for the violation.
- "(b) The provisions of subsection (a) shall not apply to:
 - "(1) A child passenger under the purview of Section 32-5-222, who is required to use a child passenger restraint system or a seat belt pursuant to Section 32-5-222.
 - "(2) An occupant of a passenger car who possesses a written statement from a licensed physician that he <u>or she</u> is unable for medical reasons to wear a safety belt.
 - "(3) A rural letter carrier of the United States

 Postal Service while performing his <u>or her</u> duties as a rural letter carrier.
- "(4) A driver or passenger delivering newspapers or mail from house to house.
- 26 "(5) Passengers in a passenger car with model year 27 prior to 1965.

"(6) Passengers in motor vehicles which normally operate in reverse."

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
