10 TO BE ENTITLED
11 AN ACT
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13 To alter, rearrange, and extend the boundary lines
14 and corporate limits of the Town of Baker Hill in Barbour
15 County.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

17 Section 1. The boundary lines and corporate limits
18 of the Town of Baker Hill in Barbour County are altered,
19 rearranged, and extended to include within the corporate
20 limits of the municipality, in addition to the lands now
21 included, all of the following territory:

22 Commencing at the existing North City Limits of the
23 Town of Baker Hill, Barbour County, Alabama and the centerline
24 of Barbour County Road 79, also being the POINT OF BEGINNING;

25 Thence, along the centerline of Barbour County Road
26 79, Northerly and Northwesterly to the centerline of Edgar
27 Woods Road;

1 Thence, along the centerline of Edgar Woods Road to
2 the centerline of the East Fork of the Choctawhatchee River;

3 Thence, along the centerline of the Choctawhatchee
4 River to the centerline of Williams Mill Road;

5 Thence, along the centerline of Williams Mill Road
6 to the West line of the existing City Limits of the Town of
7 Baker Hill, Barbour County, Alabama;

8 Thence, along the existing City Limits of the Town
9 of Baker Hill, Barbour County, Alabama Northerly to the
10 Northwest corner of the existing City Limits of the Town of
11 Baker Hill, Barbour County, Alabama;

12 Thence, Easterly along said existing City Limits of
13 the Town of Baker Hill, Barbour County, Alabama to the
14 centerline of Barbour County Road 79 and the POINT OF
15 BEGINNING.

16 Section 2. In accordance with Section 11-42-6(b) of
17 the Code of Alabama 1975, a map showing what territory is
18 proposed to be annexed to the Town of Baker Hill is on file in
19 the office of the Judge of Probate in Barbour County, Alabama,
20 and the map is open to the inspection of the public.

21 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
22 first day of the third month following its passage and
23 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
