| 26 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: |

Section 1. Section 22-1-15, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 "\$22-1-15.

- "(a) Upon the request of a person medically diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder or any other cognitive, mental, neurological, or physical disability, or the guardian or caregiver of the person, the Alabama Department of Public Health shall issue a certification card denoting that the person has been medically diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder or the disability. The certification card and the person's driver's license may be presented to law enforcement as necessary.
- "(b) The Alabama Department of Public Health shall establish by rule the proof required to be produced by a person medically diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder or any other cognitive, mental, neurological, or physical disability who requests a certification card under subsection (a).
- "(c) The department may collect a reasonable fee for the issuance of the certification card as determined by the department."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective January

 1, 2021, following its passage and approval by the Governor,

 or its otherwise becoming law.
