The purpose or effect of this bill would be 3 to require a new or increased expenditure of local 5 funds within the meaning of the amendment.  intentionally flee by any means from anyone the person knows

 - "(b) It shall be unlawful for a person while operating a motor vehicle on a street, road, alley, or highway in this state, to intentionally flee or attempt to elude a law enforcement officer after having received a signal from the officer to bring the vehicle to a stop.
 - "(c) $\underline{(1)}$ A violation of subsection (a) or (b) is a Class A misdemeanor unless the.
 - "(2) A violation of subsection (a) or (b) is a Class

 C felony if the flight or attempt to elude causes death or

 physical injury to any other person:
 - "(d) In addition, the Upon conviction of subsection

 (a) or (b), the court shall order the suspension of the driver's license of the defendant for a period of not less than six months nor more than two years."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
