9	Citizen Alert Act provides a rapid response to
10	missing or lost senior citizens who are at risk of

12	This bill would expand existing law to
13	include missing and endangered persons suffering
14	from a mental or physical disability who are at
15	risk of bodily harm or death.

21	Relating to missing and endangered persons; to amend
22	Sections 26-19A-1, 26-19A-2, 26-19A-3, 26-19A-4, and 26-19A-5,
23	Code of Alabama 1975, to expand existing law to include
24	missing and endangered persons suffering from a mental or
25	physical disability who are at risk of bodily harm or death.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1	Section 1. Sections 26-19A-1, 26-19A-2, 26-19A-3,
2	26-19A-4, and 26-19A-5, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to
3	read as follows:
4	"§26-19A-1.
5	"This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the
6	Missing <del>Senior Citizen</del> <u>and Endangered Persons</u> Alert Act.
7	"§26-19A-2.
8	"The Missing <del>Senior Citizen</del> <u>and Endangered Persons</u>
9	Alert Act is enacted for the following purposes:
10	"(1) To provide a rapid response to missing or lost
11	<del>senior citizens</del> <u>persons suffering from a mental disability,</u>
12	physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism
13	<u>and are</u> at risk of bodily harm or death <del>or persons suffering</del>
14	from Alzheimer's disease or dementia.
15	"(2) To gain the voluntary assistance of the
16	broadcast media to help locate missing <del>senior citizens</del> <u>and</u>
17	endangered persons.
18	"§26-19A-3.
19	"When used in this chapter, the following words and
20	terms shall have the following meanings:
21	"(1) ACJIC. The Alabama Criminal Justice Information
22	<del>Center.</del>
23	" <del>(2)</del> <u>(1)</u> BROADCASTER. Any entity that is engaged in
24	the business of broadcasting video or audio programs, whether
25	through the public airwaves, by cable, by direct or indirect
26	satellite transmissions, or by any other means of
27	communication.

"(3) (2) DEPARTMENT. The Alabama State Law
 Enforcement Agency.

"(4) (3) MISSING SENIOR CITIZEN AND ENDANGERED 3 PERSONS ALERT. A voluntary program entered into by the 4 department and other local and state law enforcement agencies 5 and the Alabama Association of Broadcasters and broadcasters 6 7 licensed to serve in the state, which provides that if the 8 department verifies that a senior citizen person suffering from a mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's 9 10 disease, dementia, or autism is missing or lost and in danger, a media alert is transmitted. The broadcasters participating 11 12 in the program then issue a distribute the media alert. 13 "§26-19A-4.

14 "(a) A missing senior citizen and endangered persons 15 alert shall be activated by the department when a citizen 16 person is reported missing and an investigation reveals the 17 following:

"(1) The citizen person is suffering from a mental
disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease,
dementia, or autism and is at risk of bodily harm or death, or
suffers from Alzheimer's disease or dementia. An alert may be
issued for a person suffering from Alzheimer's disease or
dementia regardless of age.

"(2) There is enough descriptive information about
the senior or person suffering from Alzheimer's disease or
dementia a mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's
disease, dementia, or autism and at risk of bodily harm or

death to believe an immediate media alert would help 1 2 investigators locate the person. For persons suffering from Alzheimer's disease or dementia a mental disability, physical 3 disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism, a 4 5 statement from a caregiver that the missing person suffers from either disease a mental disability, physical disability, 6 7 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism shall be considered sufficient proof of the disease mental disability, physical 8 disability, Alzheimer's disease, <u>dementia</u>, or <u>autism</u>. 9

10 "(b) A report of a missing senior citizen or missing person suffering from Alzheimer's disease or dementia and 11 12 endangered person may be made by a local law enforcement 13 agency to the department as soon as a concerned party or caregiver believes the person to be missing and the 14 15 originating local law enforcement agency has entered identifying and descriptive information about the missing and 16 17 endangered person to the Alabama Center for Missing and 18 Exploited Children and to the National Crime Information Center pursuant to Section 26-19-7. Upon the submission of the 19 report, a search in the missing and endangered person's local 20 21 area may begin immediately, and the department may expand the 22 search to include areas outside of the missing and endangered 23 person's local area if needed.

"(c) The department and local law enforcement
agencies shall require law enforcement officers and other
emergency personnel to complete first responder training for
missing persons with Alzheimer's disease or other forms of

1 dementia, if such training is available through the 2 department, the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training 3 Commission, or the free training and certification program offered by the Alzheimer's Association. If a missing and 4 5 endangered person report is made for a person suffering from 6 Alzheimer's disease or dementia, the department and local law 7 enforcement agencies shall utilize, if available, personnel 8 who have participated in this training to assist in conducting 9 the search.

"§26-19A-5.

"Once a determination has been made to activate the missing senior citizen and endangered person media alert, the originating agency department shall do the following:

"(1) Issue a local media alert via E-mail and fax
 indicating that a senior citizen person suffering from a
 mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease,
 dementia, or autism is missing and believed to be in danger.

"(2) Prepare and send via E-mail and fax the
information and description of the missing senior and
endangered person to the media in the appropriate area.

"(3) Supplement the information by descriptions or photographs of the person to the media and the public through the following:

"a. E-mail description.

25 "b. Post the missing senior's <u>and endangered</u>
26 person's photograph on the department's website.

- 1 "(4)a. Once the senior missing and endangered person is found or the case is closed, the initiating law enforcement 2 3 agency shall notify the department which shall distribute a media alert cancellation. 4 "b. Law enforcement officials shall notify other 5 agencies of the cancellation." 6 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 7 first day of the third month following its passage and 8
- 9 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
