21	structures, owned by the Cullman County Board of Education.
22	Members To the extent allowed under Section 36-1-12, Code of
23	Alabama 1975, members of the governing body are immune from
24	civil liability for actions taken in the conduct of their
25	duties relating to the Garden City school property.
26	(b)(1) The governing body of the Town of Garden City
27	may accept title to the former Garden City school property

owned by the Cullman County Board of Education and may hold
the property for the benefit and use of the public,

particularly the of Garden City. The governing body of the

Town of Garden City may receive state, local, and other

governmental funding and may accept charitable donations for

the operation, management, and preservation of the former

Garden City school property.

(2) The governing body of the Town of Garden City may not sell or transfer ownership of the property unless approved by majority vote of the governing body and then by a majority vote of the qualified electors in the Town of Garden City at a referendum called by the Judge of Probate of Cullman County and held during the following general election.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
