10 TO BE ENTITLED
11 AN ACT

13 To alter, rearrange, and extend the boundary lines
14 and corporate limits of the municipality of Hayden in Blount
15 County.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

17 Section 1. The boundary lines and corporate limits
18 of the municipality of Hayden in Blount County are altered,
19 rearranged, and extended to include within the corporate
20 limits of the municipality, in addition to the lands now
21 included, all of the following territory:

22 In Blount County:

23 A part of the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 6,
24 Township 13, Range 1 West, more particularly described as
25 follows: Beginning where the SW right-of-way line of the New
26 Bangor Highway (County Road 9) intersects the West boundary
27 line of said NW 1/4 of SW 1/4 slightly south of the NW corner

1 of said 1/4 - 1/4 Section; thence in a Southeasterly direction
2 along the SW right-of-way line of the said New Bangor Highway
3 (County Road 9) a distance of 130 yards (360 feet), more or
4 less, to where said right-of-way line intersects the NW
5 right-of-way line of the Cleveland-Hayden Highway (State
6 Highway 160); thence in a Southwesterly direction along the NW
7 right-of-way line of the Cleveland-Hayden Highway (state
8 Highway 160) a distance of 128 yards (384 feet), more or less
9 to where said NW right-of-way line intersects the West
10 boundary line of said 1/4 - 1/4 section; thence North along
11 the West boundary of said 1/4 - 1/4 Section 158 yards (474
12 feet), more or less, to point of beginning.

13 Section 2. In accordance with Section 11-42-6(b) of
14 the Code of Alabama 1975, a map showing what territory is
15 proposed to be annexed to the municipality of Hayden is on
16 file in the office of the Judge of Probate in Blount County,
17 Alabama, and the map is open to the inspection of the public.

18 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
19 first day of the third month following its passage and
20 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
