Harris; and WHEREAS, a native of Montgomery, Alabama, Reverend 14 15 Harris received his early education in the Montgomery Public 16 School System; his undergraduate studies were performed at The 17 Alabama State University where he majored in Business 18 Administration and Economics; he was named a distinguished "Alumni On the Move"; he is a graduate of the Graduate School 19 20 of Banking at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge, 21 Louisiana; and 22 WHEREAS, a United States Army Veteran, Reverend 23 Harris served during the Vietnam War with tours of duty in 24 Vietnam as well as Thailand and Okinawa; he was honorably 25 discharged in 1969, and is the recipient of the US Army Commendation Medal; and 26

WHEREAS, in 1990, he joined the Regions Financial 1 2 Corporation and received numerous awards during his thirty-year tenure, including being named "Outstanding Alabama 3 Banker of the Year" in 1985; he retired as Senior Vice 4 5 President, Regional Group manager and Regional Economic Development Officer in 2000; he was elected to the Board of 6 7 Directors of Baptist Health Hospital System in Montgomery, 8 Alabama, where he served as a distinguished member from 1990-9 1994; and

10 WHEREAS, Reverend Harris has served as Senior pastor of six AME Churches in Alabama during his forty-two years of 11 12 pastoral ministry, which include Saint Peter, Montgomery; 13 Quinn Chapel, Uniontown; Saint Joseph, Autaugaville; Saint Paul, Troy; and Saint Paul, Montgomery - the home church of 14 15 Mrs. Rosa Parks who was known as the Mother of the Montgomery Bus Boycott that launched the Civil Rights struggle for Voting 16 17 Rights in the South; and

18 WHEREAS, he last served as the Senior Pastor of Historic Brown Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church in 19 20 Selma, Alabama - where the "Bloody Sunday" March for civil 21 rights across the Edmund Pettis Bridge began in 1965; at the 22 35th Commemoration of that memorable act, Reverend Harris welcomed President William Jefferson "Bill" Clinton to Selma 23 and delivered the invocation to a nationwide television 24 25 audience during the bridge crossing ceremony; under his 26 pastoral tenure, he was instrumental in Brown Chapel being designated as a National Historical Place by the United States 27

Parks Service; the honorable Bruce Babbitt, former Secretary
of Interior presented this designation to Reverend Harris on
behalf of Brown Chapel in Washington, D.C.; and

WHEREAS, in the year 2000 at the 46th Session of the General Conference, Reverend Harris was elected a General Officer of the Church and the 7th Executive Director of the Department of Retirement Services; for the past twenty years since his election, he has been responsible for the administration and management of the retirement investment and insurance programs sponsored by the Church; and

11 WHEREAS, under his managerial leadership, the 12 retirement investment portfolio has grown from \$47.5M to its 13 current value of approximately \$125M - a growth of more than 14 70 percent; he has been re-elected to this position at the 15 2004, 2008, 2012, and 2016 General Conferences without 16 opposition and by unanimous consent; and

WHEREAS, additionally, Reverend Harris is responsible for the administration of the AMEC Group Life Insurance Plan for the clergy and their families, currently underwritten by the Principal Life Insurance Company as well as the Connectional Stewardship Program for the Church; and
