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- 1 (a) The committee shall consist of the following 2 members:
- 3 (1) Four members of the House of Representatives 4 appointed by the Speaker of the House.

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- (2) Four members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- (b) The committee shall have co-chairs; one
 Representative appointed by the Speaker of the House and one
 Senator appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- (c) The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure the committee is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographical, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- (d) The committee shall meet as needed by the call of the co-chairs in multiple regions of the state to hear from organizations impacted by the shortage of volunteers for volunteer fire departments, for community medical responders, and for other community services.
- (e) Members of the committee shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the committee, in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.
- (f) The committee shall issue a report and recommendations to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and the Legislature no later than the fifth legislative day of the 2021 Regular Session, at which time it shall stand dissolved.
