in 1999, he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science;

subsequently, he furthered his education at Long Island

University, where he received a Master of Arts Degree in

WHEREAS, Mr. Richardson had a very successful career in politics and worked in Alabama, Maryland, New York, and Washington, D.C.; he co-founded the lobbying firm, Epps, Richardson, and Associates; was the first African American to hold the position of Director of Public Policy for the Birmingham Chamber of Commerce; was the Senior Director for state and regional affairs for Center for American Progress in Washington, D.C.; was the Legislative Budget Director for the New York City Council; was the Director of Domestic Policy for the Lutheran Church in America; and was the Manager of Government Relations for Van Scoyoc Associates in Washington, D.C.; recently, he served as a District Press Secretary with U.S. Representative Terri A. Sewell; while working for Representative Sewell, Mr. Richardson addressed the challenges that the 7th Congressional District constituents faced, including unemployment, crime, human trafficking, and the lack of career and college readiness; he had also served as the Inaugural Executive Director of The Alabama Alliance of the Boys and Girls Club; and

WHEREAS, he was recognized by numerous organizations for his commitment to service; he earned the Veteran of Influence Award from the Birmingham Business Journal, the Maryland Gubernatorial Proclamation for Outstanding Public Service, and the Alabama Legislative Black Caucus Award: Trailblazer and Successful Lobbyist; and
