16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Sections 26-19A-1, 26-19A-2, 26-19A-3,
18	26-19A-4, and 26-19A-5, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to
19	read as follows:
20	"§26-19A-1.
21	"This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the
22	Missing Senior Citizen <u>and Endangered Persons</u> Alert Act.
23	"§26-19A-2.
24	"The Missing Senior Citizen and Endangered Persons
25	Alert Act is enacted for the following purposes:
26	"(1) To provide a rapid response to missing or lost
27	senior citizens persons living with a mental disability,

physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism 1 2 and are at risk of bodily harm or death or persons suffering from Alzheimer's disease or dementia. 3 "(2) To gain the voluntary assistance of the 4 5 broadcast media to help locate missing senior citizens and endangered persons. 6 7 "§26-19A-3. "When used in this chapter, the following words and 8 terms shall have the following meanings: 9 10 "(1) ACJIC. The Alabama Criminal Justice Information 11 Center. "(2) (1) BROADCASTER. Any entity that is engaged in 12 13 the business of broadcasting video or audio programs, whether through the public airwaves, by cable, by direct or indirect 14 satellite transmissions, or by any other means of 15 16 communication. 17 "(3) (2) DEPARTMENT. The Alabama State Law 18 Enforcement Agency. "(4) (3) MISSING SENIOR CITIZEN <u>AND ENDANGERED</u> 19 20 PERSONS ALERT. A voluntary program entered into by the 21 department and other local and state law enforcement agencies and the Alabama Association of Broadcasters and broadcasters 22 23 licensed to serve in the state, which provides that if the 24 department verifies that a senior citizen person living with a 25 mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism is missing or lost and in danger, a media 26

alert is transmitted. The broadcasters participating in the
 program then issue a distribute the media alert.

"§26-19A-4.

4 "(a) A missing senior citizen and endangered persons
5 alert shall be activated by the department when a citizen
6 person is reported missing and an investigation reveals the
7 following:

8 "(1) The <u>citizen person</u> is <u>living with a mental</u> 9 <u>disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease,</u> 10 <u>dementia, or autism and is</u> at risk of bodily harm or death, or 11 <u>suffers from Alzheimer's disease or dementia. An alert may be</u> 12 <u>issued for a person suffering from Alzheimer's disease or</u> 13 <u>dementia regardless of age</u>.

"(2) There is enough descriptive information about 14 15 the senior or person suffering from living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia a mental disability, physical disability, 16 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism and at risk of bodily 17 18 harm or death to believe an immediate media alert would help investigators locate the person. For persons suffering from 19 20 living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia a mental 21 disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, 22 dementia, or autism, a statement from a caregiver that the 23 missing person suffers from lives with either disease a mental 24 disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, 25 dementia, or autism shall be considered sufficient proof of the disease mental disability, physical disability, 26 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism. 27

"(b) A report of a missing senior citizen or missing 1 2 person suffering from Alzheimer's disease or dementia and endangered person may be made by a local law enforcement 3 agency to the department as soon as a concerned party or 4 5 caregiver believes the person to be missing and the originating local law enforcement agency has entered 6 7 identifying and descriptive information about the missing and 8 endangered person to the Alabama Center for Missing and 9 Exploited Children and to the National Crime Information 10 Center pursuant to Section 26-19-7. Upon the submission of the report, a search in the missing and endangered person's local 11 area may begin immediately, and the department may expand the 12 13 search to include areas outside of the missing and endangered person's local area if needed. 14

15 "(c) The department and local law enforcement 16 agencies shall require law enforcement officers and other 17 emergency personnel to complete first responder training for 18 missing persons with Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia, if such training is available through the 19 20 department, the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training 21 Commission, or the free training and certification program 22 offered by the Alzheimer's Association. If a missing and 23 endangered person report is made for a person suffering from 24 living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia, the department 25 and local law enforcement agencies shall utilize, if available, personnel who have participated in this training to 26 assist in conducting the search. 27

"Once a determination has been made to activate the 2 3 missing senior citizen and endangered person media alert, the originating agency department shall do the following: 4 "(1) Issue a local media alert via E-mail and fax 5 6 indicating that a senior citizen person living with a mental 7 disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism is missing and believed to be in danger. 8 9 "(2) Prepare and send via E-mail and fax the 10 information and description of the missing senior and endangered person to the media in the appropriate area. 11 12 "(3) Supplement the information by descriptions or 13 photographs of the person to the media and the public through 14 the following: 15 "a. E-mail description. 16 "b. Post the missing senior's and endangered 17 person's photograph on the department's website. "(4)a. Once the senior missing and endangered person 18 is found or the case is closed, the initiating law enforcement 19 20 agency shall notify the department which shall distribute a 21 media alert cancellation. 22 "b. Law enforcement officials shall notify other agencies of the cancellation." 23 24 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 25 first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law. 26
