3 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total4 of all funding sources.

5 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services 6 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be 7 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or 8 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended 9 only for such purposes.

10 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 11 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 12 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 13 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 14 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the
payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations
of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.
"Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.
Section 2. There is hereby appropriated
the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the

In addition to the above appropriation herein made, there is hereby appropriated for each additional retail and wholesale store that is relocated or put into operation during the fiscal year, an amount equal to the sum required to install and operate a comparable store in operation by said Board. There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county or municipality there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and population. Provided further, that the amount appropriated herein shall be reduced in like manner in the event any county or municipality wherein malt and brewed beverages are now authorized by law to be sold shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, declare unlawful the sale in such county or municipality of such malt or brewed beverages. Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all revenue generated from bailment fees shall remain with the Board to be used for its operations.

The reports shall include, but not be limited to: (1) the number and amount of delinquent taxes collected during the quarter and the number and amounts of delinquent taxes outstanding as of the end of the quarter; (2) the number of additional examiners and audit personnel employed during the quarter (not including examiners and audit personnel employed to replace personnel that retire or otherwise leave state service); and (3) the number of new personal computers and related equipment put into use during the quarter.

The State General Fund appropriations in 6 7 this act anticipate a beginning balance in the State General Fund for fiscal year 2021, excluding reversions and 8 adjustments, of \$218,809,888. If the State General Fund 9 beginning balance for fiscal year 2021, excluding reversions 10 11 and adjustments, is greater than the above stated anticipated 12 amount, then twenty percent of the unanticipated and 13 unappropriated beginning balance is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund and shall be transferred to the General 14 15 Fund Budget Reserve Fund established in SB129 of the 2020 Regular Session. 16

17 Section 5. Notwithstanding any other provisions of 18 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 19 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to the various 20 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 21 on September 30, 2020, are hereby reappropriated to the 22 respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 23 2020.

7 Section 9. Any surplus remaining in any appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any 8 office, department, bureau, board, commission, or agency may 9 10 be transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when 11 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 12 13 commission, or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission, or agency. 14

15 Section 10. (a) In addition to appropriations herein 16 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions, or 17 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 18 including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities, or counties, to any department, division, 19 20 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office, or 21 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 22 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 23 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 24 institution, office, or officer to be used only for the 25 purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal, and 26 educational entities are authorized to disburse such sums as 27

deemed necessary by mutual agreement among said entities, the 1 2 State of Alabama, and the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts to partially defray the cost of auditing services 3 performed by said agency. All such sums are hereby 4 5 appropriated and reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be 6 7 expended through the fund established by Section 41-5A-22, Code of Alabama 1975. 8

(b) Provided, however, this section shall not apply 9 10 to the state Coronavirus Relief Fund amounts provided by the Congress of the United States to the State of Alabama from the 11 Coronavirus, Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act 12 13 (P.L. 116-136), except for an amount not to exceed \$100,000,000 for expenditures related to the coronavirus 14 15 pandemic. This section shall also not apply to any additional federal stimulus funds provided to the state to offset revenue 16 17 losses or for purposes directly related to the coronavirus 18 pandemic, other than additional funds provided for existing 19 federal programs.

20 Section 11. The Department of Examiners of Public 21 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 22 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 23 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in 24 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5A, Code 25 of Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 26 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery 27

audits as provided for in Section 41-5A-6, Code of Alabama
 1975.

Section 12. Upon certification to the Director of 3 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 4 5 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 6 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 7 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 8 9 department, board, bureau, or commission in the amount 10 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 11 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 12 13 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 14 15 not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 13. All interest earned from funds paid into 16 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 17 18 90-556, and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 19 20 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 21 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 22 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd 23 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 24 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.
