8	NAMING THE NEW BRIDGE ON HIGHWAY 205 IN ALBERTVILLE
9	(RABBIT TOWN) IN HONOR OF OLA LEE MIZE.

11	WHEREAS, Ola Lee Mize of Albertville, Alabama, is
12	one of Alabama's greatest war heroes and it is appropriate and
13	fitting that the new bridge on Highway 205 in Albertville
14	(Rabbit Town) be named in his honor; and
15	WHEREAS, Mize was born in Albertville, Alabama, the
16	son of a sharecropper, he left school after the 9th grade to
17	support his family, after several years of working for low
18	pay, he attempted to enlist in the Army, but was initially
19	rejected for being underweight; after repeated tries, he was
20	eventually accepted by the Army; and
21	WHEREAS, assigned to the 82nd Airborne Division,
22	Mize planned to finish his term of service and return to
23	school, when the Korean War began, he changed his plans and
24	reenlisted in hopes of seeing combat and he volunteered for a
25	front-line unit and ended up a Sergeant in Company K of the
26	15th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Infantry Division; on June 10th,
27	1953, his unit was manning Outpost Harry near Surang-ni,

Korea, when the post came under heavy enemy attack; Mize organized defensive positions, rescued wounded soldiers, and engaged the enemy until reinforcements arrived about noon the next day; he was subsequently promoted to Master Sergeant and, on September 24th, 1954, awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions at Outpost Harry; and

WHEREAS, Mize later joined the special forces where he gained a commission and served three tours of duty in the Vietnam War; in 1965, he was assigned to the Special Forces Training Group, where he was the Advanced Training Committee Chief for Scuba, Halo, and the Skyhook schools; he commanded the Special Forces school at Fort Bragg; Colonel Mize is credited for being the officer responsible for starting the present-day Combat Divers Qualification Course in Key West, Florida; from 1966 to 1967, he was again assigned to the 5th Special Forces Group as the commander of B-36 3rd Mobile Strike Force, he was awarded the Silver Star for Valor Badge with one star, Master Parachutist Badge, Ranger Tab, Special Forces Tab, Legion of Merit with One Leaf Cluster, Bronze Star with Four Oak Leaf Clusters and "V" Device, Purple Heart, Air Medal and several others; and

WHEREAS, he met Presidents Eisenhower and Kennedy and he retired as a colonel; and

WHEREAS, Mize died on March 12, 2014, in Gadsden, Alabama, at age 82; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we do hereby designate the

bridge on Highway 205 in Albertville, Alabama, as the Colonel

Ola Lee Mize Bridge and request the appropriate officials to

place and maintain signs or markers as provided in this

resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this

resolution be provided for presentation as a memento of this

honorary designation by the Alabama Legislature.
