The principal purpose of the 15 commission shall be to plan, promote, and implement where 16 appropriate public celebrations and commemorations of the 17 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence on July 18 4, 2026, and of the 250th Anniversary of the United States of America. 19 20 (b) The commission is authorized to cooperate with 21 the United States Semiguincentennial Commission created by 22 Public Law 114-196, other national and state organizations engaged in commemoration and celebration of the United States 23 24 Semiquincentennial, and other national, regional, state, and 25 local public and private organizations having compatible

26 purposes. It shall encourage various state agencies and

organizations to work cooperatively to promote the
 Semiquincentennial.

3 (c) The commission shall consider promoting and 4 encouraging as part of its celebratory and commemorative 5 events, electronic media, printed products, symposia, and 6 educational outreach all of the following:

7 (1) Awareness and understanding of the principles of
8 the Declaration of Independence, of the winning of American
9 independence in the American Revolutionary War, and of the
10 establishment of America's system of constitutional
11 self-government.

(2) Teaching students and increasing public 12 13 knowledge and appreciation of the breadth of American history and the centuries-long quest for "liberty and justice for 14 15 all." This includes sharing the stories and contributions of the various people who have populated the land, from 16 indigenous peoples, explorers, British colonists, seekers of 17 18 religious freedom, enslaved African Americans, and many others who are part of America's stories. 19

(3) Advancing the cause of liberty and American
self-government and of the meaning of "E Pluribus Unum" ("From
many, one"), through promoting civic knowledge and practice,
including America's "Charters of Freedom" (the Declaration of
Independence, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights), and
the constitutional features of self-government which emphasize
the roles of active and engaged good citizens.

(4) Emphasizing the service and sacrifices of
 veterans of all generations who have secured and preserved
 American independence and freedom and encouraging Alabamians
 to honor them through our State's Veterans Register of Honor.

5 (5) Celebratory and commemorative events and activities throughout the State of Alabama and its sixty-seven 6 7 counties and its many municipalities. The American Village campus of the Citizenship Trust ("Trust") chartered pursuant 8 9 to Section 16-44A-30 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, is 10 designated as an Alabama "celebration capitol" of the commission and a national and regional welcome and education 11 center for the United States Semiquincentennial. 12

13 (d) Membership of the commission shall consist of14 eleven voting members as follows:

15 (1) The Governor of Alabama who shall serve as16 Honorary Chair of the commission.

17 (2) Two members appointed by the Lieutenant18 Governor.

19 (3) Two members appointed by the President Pro
20 Tempore of the Senate and two members appointed by the Speaker
21 of the House of Representatives.

(4) Two members who are Alabamians serving on the
United States Semiquincentennial Commission as certified by
the executive officer of that commission.

25 (5) Two citizens at large, appointed by the26 Governor.

(6) Members shall serve for the life of the
 commission, provided any public official's expiration of his
 or her term shall create a vacancy, and all vacancies shall be
 filled in the same manner as originally appointed.

5 (e) The appointing authorities shall coordinate
6 their appointments so that diversity of gender, race, and
7 geographical areas is reflective of the makeup of this state.

8 (f)(1) The commission shall elect its chair, vice 9 chair and any other officers it deems necessary and shall 10 adopt its rules for establishment of a quorum and conduct of 11 business.

(2) Commission members shall serve without
 compensation or expenses, but legislative members may receive
 legislative expenses.

15 (3) The chair, with concurrence of the commission, may designate the chief executive officer of an agency or 16 17 non-profit organization created or chartered by legislative 18 act, or another qualified individual, to serve as the executive officer and secretary of the commission. The 19 executive officer shall serve without additional compensation 20 21 but may be reimbursed for expenses as provided for state 22 employees. He or she shall exercise such powers delegated by 23 the commission, including the right to apply for, receive, 24 accept, deposit, and administer pursuant to commission 25 authorization any federal, state, or local public or private 26 funds given for express use by the commission for the Semiquincentennial. 27

(4) No elected public official serving on the
 commission shall be involved in soliciting any private funds
 or gifts for the commission.

(q) The chair of the commission, with concurrence of 4 5 the commission, shall constitute one or more advisory committees to advise the commission. The committees may 6 include such representatives as the respective executive 7 officer or his or her designee of any of the following: The 8 9 Alabama Department of Archives and History, the Alabama 10 Department of Tourism, the Alabama Department of Education, the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, the Alabama 11 12 Community College System, the Alabama Department of Economic 13 Development, the Alabama Department of Military Affairs, the Alabama Historical Commission, or the Alabama Department of 14 15 Veterans Affairs; and representatives of presidents of Alabama's public colleges and universities, Alabama's 16 17 historically black colleges and universities, community 18 colleges, and various associations and organizations of city and county officials, state historical, educational, 19 20 patriotic, civic, religious, military and veterans 21 organizations, and community improvement and other organizations. 22

(h) The commission shall make an annual written
report and make any recommendations to the Governor and
Legislature at least thirty days prior to the convening of
each Regular Session of the Legislature, commencing in 2021
and continuing through its final report in 2027. The

commission shall consider and recommend ways for the state to 1 2 commemorate the Semiguincentennial through state and local 3 legacy projects for the state at large and for counties and 4 municipalities, and ways to enhance educational programs and extended learning offered by local boards of education, the 5 Department of Education, Citizenship Trust, relevant state 6 7 agencies and departments, two and four year institutions of higher education, including historically black colleges and 8 universities. 9

10 (i) The commission and its advisory committees shall
11 be dissolved upon the adjournment of the Regular Session in
12 2027.
