novel coronavirus, known as COVID-19, the extent, severity,
and duration of which has yet to be determined; and

3 WHEREAS, citizens of this state have been urged to 4 stay at home, to separate, and to sanitize, in order to slow 5 the progression of this pandemic and the danger to the 6 citizens, including death; and

7 WHEREAS, those citizens with underlying health 8 conditions, including advanced years, are particularly 9 susceptible to this pandemic, whereupon many of them are 10 avoiding any and all close contact with others outside their 11 home in order to avoid infection; and

WHEREAS, those citizens so situated should not be required to enhance their exposure to the disease caused by COVID-19 in order to exercise their right to vote; and

15 WHEREAS, current Alabama law would require these 16 citizens, be they predisposed to infection due to another 17 health condition, or simply because they fear infection, to 18 falsely affirm they have a "physical illness or infirmity which prevents his or her attendance at the polls" in order to 19 exercise their right to vote, thereby subjecting themselves to 20 21 prosecution for falsifying an absentee ballot application or verification document "so as to vote absentee," of which 22 23 charge a finding of guilt would constitute a Class C felony"; 24 and

25 WHEREAS, it is important, even in times such as 26 these, for our citizens to be able to cast their votes in any

and all elections without fear that to do so might enhance
their exposure to a serious, even deadly, disease; and

3 WHEREAS, at least 29 states plus the District of 4 Columbia, currently allow citizens to cast an absentee ballot 5 without an "excuse"; now therefore,

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE LEGISLATURE OF 7 ALABAMA, That, during these trying and uncertain times, it is 8 imperative to the democratic process to propose and adopt 9 legislation revising existing law to allow "no excuse" 10 absentee voting.
