8	SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, lotteries and gift
9	enterprises are prohibited.
10	This bill would propose an amendment to
11	Section 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,
12	to establish an Alabama Lottery; the Alabama
13	Lottery Corporation; the Alabama Lottery Commission
14	to regulate and supervise the operation of the
15	Alabama Lottery Corporation; and the Lottery Trust
16	Fund; and require the Legislature to pass general
17	laws to implement the amendment.

19	A BILL
20	TO BE ENTITLED
21	AN ACT
22	
23	Proposing an amendment to Section 65 of the
24	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to establish an Alabama
25	Lottery; the Alabama Lottery Corporation to administer the
26	lottery; the Alabama Lottery Commission to regulate and
27	supervise the Alabama Lottery Corporation; and the Lottery

1	Trust Fund; and to require the Legislature to implement the
2	amendment through enabling legislation.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
4	Section 1. The following amendment to the
5	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and
6	shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a
7	majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in
8	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution
9	of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284, 285, and
10	287 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
11	Alabama of 1901, as amended:
12	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
13	"Section 65.
14	"PART I.
15	"The Except as provided in Part II, the legislature
16	<u>Legislature</u> shall have no power to authorize lotteries or gift
17	enterprises for any purposes, and shall pass laws to prohibit
18	the sale in this state of lottery or gift enterprise tickets,
19	or tickets in any scheme in the nature of a lottery; and
20	except as provided in Part II, all acts, or parts of acts
21	heretofore passed by the <del>legislature</del> <u>Legislature</u> of this
22	state, authorizing a lottery or lotteries, and all acts
23	amendatory thereof, or supplemental thereto, are hereby
24	avoided voided.
25	"PART II.
26	"Section 1. For the purposes of this amendment, the
27	following terms shall have the following meanings:

Τ	"(1) COMMISSION. The Alabama Lottery Commission.
2	"(2) CORPORATION. The Alabama Lottery Corporation.
3	"(3) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. The Executive Director of
4	the Alabama Lottery Corporation.
5	"(4) RETAILER. Any person with whom the corporation
6	has contracted to sell lottery tickets to the public.
7	"Section 2. Establishment of the Alabama Lottery;
8	Alabama Lottery Corporation; and Alabama Lottery Commission.
9	"(a) There is hereby established the Alabama Lottery
10	which shall be administered by an independent, de jure
11	municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State
12	of Alabama which shall be a public body, corporate and
13	politic, created and designated as the Alabama Lottery
14	Corporation.
15	"(b) The affairs of the corporation shall be
16	administered by an executive director who shall be appointed
17	by the Alabama Lottery Commission which is hereby established
18	as the governing board for the corporation.
19	"(c) The Legislature shall provide for the control,
20	management, and operation of the Alabama Lottery and the
21	composition, powers, and duties of the Alabama Lottery
22	Corporation and the Alabama Lottery Commission in one or more
23	general laws supplemental to this part.
24	"Section 3. Lottery Trust Fund.
25	"(a) The proceeds form the Alabama Lottery shall be
26	applied first to the payment of the expenses of administering
27	and operating the Alabama Lottery, including, without

1	limitation, the payment of all prizes, without any further
2	appropriation are required by law, and the balance of the
3	proceeds remaining after the payments shll be deposited and
4	held in a special, separate account in the State Treasury
5	hereby created and designated as the Lottery Trust fund until
6	the time as the proceeds are disbursed as provide by general
7	law.
8	"(b) The corporation shall be self-sustaining and
9	self-funded and monies in the state General Fund or the
10	Education Trust Fund shall not be used or obligated to pay the
11	expenses of the corporation or prizes of the lottery, and no
12	claim for the payment of an expense of the lottery or prizes
13	of the lottery shall be made against any monies other than
14	monies credited to the Lottery Trust Fund.
15	"(c) Monthly, no later than the last business day of
16	the succeeding month, the corporation shall transfer to the
17	Lottery Trust Fund the amount of net revenues which the
18	corporation determines surplus to its needs.
19	"(d) Monies credited to the Lottery Trust Fund shall
20	be invested in accordance with state investment practices and
21	all earnings from the investment shall accrue to the fund.
22	"Section 4. Games Allowed; Games Not Allowed.
23	"(a) The corporation may allow lottery games of all
24	types. Games may include, but are not limited to, new games,
25	draw lotteries of various types, interstate lotteries such as

scratch-offs, Keno, and iLottery, or any other lottery offered

Powerball and Mega Millions, instant winners such as

1	in another state. The corporation shall make participation
2	convenient by ensuring that purchases are available at retail
3	outlets either by ticket purchase from an employee or from a
4	kiosk or vending machine that does not require an employee to
5	handle the transaction. The corporation may allow iLottery,
6	mobile platforms, and computer purchases.
7	"(b) The corporation may not approve or operate
8	video lottery terminals or any casino or similar gambling
9	establishment and may not approve or operate any game played
10	with playing cards, dice, dominos, slot machines, or roulette
11	wheels. Any game using live dealers is strictly prohibited.
12	"Section 6. Effect on existing Law.
13	"(a) Nothing in this part affects, prohibits, or
14	limits any activity that was legal at the time this part
15	becomes effective including, without limitation, pari-mutuel
16	betting and charity bingo, as provided for by specific laws.
17	"(b) The operation of a lottery or lottery game
18	authorized by this part is not subject to or prohibited,
19	limited, or impaired by otherwise applicable provisions of
20	Article 8, commencing with Section 8-1-150, of Chapter 1 of
21	Title 8, or Article 2, commencing with Section 13A-12-20, of
22	Chapter 12 of Title 13A of the Code of Alabama 1975.
23	"Section 7. This part and any enabling legislation
24	enacted by the Legislature with respect to this part
25	supersedes and takes precedence over any other provision of
26	law that may conflict or be inconsistent with this part or the

legislation, and this part and the legislation shall operate

Τ	and be construed without regard to the conflict or
2	inconsistency.
3	Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
4	shall be held, in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the
5	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284
6	and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
7	Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the general election laws of
8	this state.
9	Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
10	assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
11	amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
12	following description on the proposed constitutional
13	amendment:
14	"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of
15	Alabama of 1901, to establish an Alabama Lottery; create an
16	Alabama Lottery Corporation to administer the lottery;
17	establish the Alabama Lottery Commission to regulate and
18	supervise the Alabama Lottery Corporation and require the
19	Legislature to implement the Alabama Lottery through
20	appropriate general law."
21	This description shall be followed by the following
22	language:
