4 refusing service to an individual based on that individual's
5 immunization status.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. (a) A state or local government entity,
8 or any of its officers or agents, may not issue vaccine or
9 immunization passports, vaccine or immunization passes, or any
10 other standardized documentation for the purpose of certifying
11 the immunization status of an individual, or otherwise require
12 the publication or sharing of immunization records or similar
13 health information for an individual, except as otherwise
14 required by Chapter 30 of Title 16, Code of Alabama 1975, or
15 other applicable state law.

16 (b) A state or local government entity or agency, or
17 any of its officers or agents, may not require an individual
18 to receive an immunization or present documentation of an
19 immunization as a condition for receiving any government
20 benefit or service or for entry into a government building,
21 except as otherwise required by Chapter 30 of Title 16, Code
22 of Alabama 1975, or other applicable state law.

23 (c) An entity or individual doing business in this
24 state may not refuse to provide any goods or services, or
25 refuse to allow admission to an individual, based on an
26 individual's immunization status or lack of documentation that
27 an individual has received an immunization.

1 Section 2. This act shall become effective
2 immediately following its passage and approval by the
3 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
