20		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
21		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the

26		becoming effective with regard to a local

governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote

unless: it comes within one of a number of 1 2 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

> The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

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To amend Section 20-2-25, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to Schedule II of the controlled substances list, to include additional controlled substances; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose of effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 20-2-25, Code of Alabama 1975, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "\$20-2-25. 3 "The controlled substances listed in this section 4 5 are included in Schedule II: "(1) Any of the following substances, except those 6 7 narcotic drugs listed in other schedules, whether produced directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of 8 vegetable origin or independently by means of chemical 9 10 synthesis or by combination of extraction and chemical synthesis: 11 "a. Opium and opiate and any salt, compound, 12 13 derivative, or preparation of opium or opiate. 14 "b. Any salt, compound, isomer, derivative, or 15 preparation thereof which is chemically equivalent or 16 identical with any of the substances referred to in paragraph 17 a, but not including the isoquinoline alkaloids of opium. 18 "c. Opium poppy and poppy straw. "d. Coca leaves and any salt, compound, derivative, 19 20 or preparation of coca leaves and any salt, compound, 21 derivative, or preparation thereof which is chemically 22 equivalent or identical with any of these substances, but not including decocainized coca leaves or extractions which do not 23 24 contain cocaine or ecgonine. 25 "e.
