17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
18	Section 1. Section 34-30-57 of the Code of Alabama		
19	1975, is amended to read as follows:

21	"In addition to the duties set forth elsewhere in		
22	this chapter, the Board of Social Work Examiners shall ${ m do}$ all		
23	of the following:		
24	"(1) Recommend modifications and amendments to this		
25	chapter.		
26	"(2) Recommend to the appropriate district attorneys		
27	prosecutions for the violations of this chapter, after and		

only after the alleged violator has been notified of such
 violation or violations and having been given 90 days to
 disclaim, amend, and rectify such allegation.

4 "(3) Annually publish a list of the names and
5 addresses of all persons who are:

"a. "Licensed bachelor social workers," "licensed
graduate master social workers," and "licensed certified
independent clinical social workers" under this chapter.

9 "b. Eligible to engage in the private independent 10 practice of social work under this chapter.

"(4) Establish fees for initial examination, 11 12 licensure, certification, and renewal thereof; fees for 13 verifying the existence of a current license, reactivating an inactive license, and reinstating a lapsed license; fees for 14 15 making application to the board to act as a continuing 16 education provider; and fees for registering a supervisor. 17 Nothing in this subdivision shall be interpreted as 18 requiring a state agency to pay any fees for the purposes of 19 verifying the licensure status of current or prospective 20 employees, registering any employee as a supervisor, or 21 providing continuing education to current or prospective 22 employees.

"(5) Establish requirements and standards for continuing education. In establishing such requirements, the board shall consult with those groups and organizations which represent both the levels of practice specified in this chapter and the various settings in which social work is

practiced. Furthermore, in developing such requirements, the 1 2 board shall consider, but shall not be limited in its consideration to, agency recognized staff development programs 3 under the auspices of public agencies, continuing education 4 5 programs offered by colleges and universities having social 6 work programs approved or accredited by the Council on Social 7 Work Education, and continuing education programs offered by recognized state and national social work bodies. 8

9 "(6) Promulgate Adopt rules and regulations pursuant 10 to the State Alabama Administrative Procedures Statute Procedure Act that set forth professional standards for 11 "licensed bachelor social workers," "licensed graduate master 12 13 social workers, " and "licensed certified independent clinical social workers" who are certified for the private independent 14 15 practice of social work. Those proposed rules and regulations shall be published at least 30 days prior to before the public 16 17 hearing relative to the proposed rules and regulations, and at 18 least 15 days in advance of such before the hearing, the board shall publish notice of the date, time, and place where such 19 20 the public hearings of the board will shall be held for the 21 purpose of adopting or amending rules and regulations pertaining to this chapter." 22

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective 24 immediately following its passage and approval by the 25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
