Topics of instruction shall include 3 contributions made by individual African-Americans in American 4 5 government and in the arts, humanities, and sciences, as well as the economic, cultural, and political development of the United States and Africa and the socioeconomic struggle that African-Americans have collectively experienced and continue to experience in striving to achieve fair and equal treatment 9 10 in this nation.

(b) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the implementation and enforcement of this section.
