13	legislation mandating the revocation or suspension of an

16	WHEREAS, 23 U.S.C. § 159 requires withholding eight
17	percent of certain federal aid from states that fail to enact
18	this legislation; and
19	WHEREAS, the federal government should not dictate
20	policy or legislation of this kind for the state; and
21	WHEREAS, for Alabama to be exempt from this federal
22	requirement, the Governor must submit to the United States
23	Secretary of Transportation a written certification that she

27	certification that the Alabama Legislature has adopted a

resolution expressing opposition to the federal requirement;

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama should enforce its own driver's license law, and it is the intent of the Legislature that Alabama amend its law requiring the suspension or revocation of a driver's license for certain drug-related convictions if the violation did not involve a motor vehicle to remove this requirement; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That this body declares its opposition to the enactment or enforcement of a federal law mandating, in all circumstances, the revocation or suspension of an individual's driver's license upon conviction of any drug-related offense.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature declares the state's determination to enforce its own law on the subject, which provides that an individual convicted of certain drug-related offenses will not have his or her driver's license revoked or suspended if the violation did not involve a motor vehicle.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Governor is strongly urged to submit a written certification to the United States Secretary of Transportation stating her opposition to the enforcement of \$ 23 U.S.C. \$ 159.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be delivered to the Governor so that the strong sentiments of this body may be known and that the Governor
