Alabama Broadband Connectivity project, industry grants, and individual school systems; implementing virtual network connections for accounting, maintenance and operations, and other key staff so that they could access critical systems securely, ensuring that payroll and other key services continue uninterrupted while staff works from home; installing new digital content provided by the State Department of Education and local systems into online learning management systems and aligning the lessons of all K through 12 courses to ensure that teachers and students have the resources they need; training and supporting tens of thousands of teachers in adapting to the use of online learning management systems, digital content, and live video classes using applications such as Zoom, Google Meet, and Microsoft Teams; providing teachers with quidance on best practices for virtual instruction to help improve our students' experiences and learning outcomes; providing technical support lines specifically for students, parents, and grandparents; extending service to family members and childcare providers in nearly one million Alabama households; and establishing technical solutions that support hybrid learning so that classes can continue seamlessly with some students participating in the classroom and others attending from home; now therefore, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
