11	WHEREAS, we celebrate the life of Miss Madelyn
12	"Maddie" Ann McClendon, who was born on July 12, 2002, to Mark

15	WHEREAS, Maddie grew up in Dadeville, Alabama, and
16	attended Lee Scott Academy, where she excelled as a student
17	and as an athlete: Maddie was captain of the varsity cheer
18	squad during her senior year, a member of the softball team
19	and track team, and represented her class as one of two junior
20	maids on the homecoming court; Maddie graduated from high
21	school in May of 2020, and enrolled at Auburn University in
22	the fall, where she joined the Pi Beta Phi Sorority; and
23	WHEREAS, Maddie and her family are members of the
24	First Baptist Church of Dadeville, Alabama, where Maddie
25	taught Sunday School for the past five years; she went on
26	several mission trips, including a trip to Olanchito,

Honduras, where she was the first to climb the mountain to a village after an eight-mile hike; and

WHEREAS, in October of 2020, Maddie was diagnosed with small cell carcinoma of the ovary, hypercalcemic type (SCCOHT), a highly rare and aggressive type of cancer; however, the diagnosis did not deter young Maddie; she fought gracefully and ferociously while clinging steadfastly to her Christian faith; and

WHEREAS, the testimony of Maddie's life and brave fight inspired and brought together her entire community; members of almost a dozen different churches joined together one night in prayer and worship for Maddie; several members of the community reflected that in their fight for and with Maddie, they prayed together as a family for the first time; others were taught to pray; and

WHEREAS, on the 8th of May 2021, Madelyn Ann McClendon was eternally healed when God called her home; the 18- year-old, who passed away on World Ovarian Cancer Day, continued to raise awareness of this terrible disease even on the day of her death; and

WHEREAS, the fight Maddie and her family fought against this rare and aggressive cancer has not been in vain; raising awareness of ovarian cancer is the key to finding a cure; however, because it is so difficult to diagnose, this body must work diligently to increase accessibility for women to receive screenings; and
